- 8 by Section 70.005(c).
- 9 (e) A veterinarian who does not retain possession of a large

- 11 the same manner as a statutory residential landlord's lien.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 70.010, Property Code, as added by this
- 13 Act, applies only to an amount that becomes due to a veterinarian on
- 14 or after the effective date of this Act. An amount that becomes due
- 15 to a veterinarian before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 16 by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of
- 17 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
