- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 65.012, Water Code, is amended to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 Sec. 65.012. PURPOSES OF DISTRICT. A district may be
- 8 created [for the following purposes]:
- 9 (1) to purchase, own, hold, lease, and otherwise
- 10 acquire sources of water supply; to build, operate, and maintain
- 11 facilities for the transportation of water; and to sell water to
- 12 towns, cities, and other political subdivisions of this state, to
- private business entities, and to individuals;
- 14 (2) for the establishment, operation, and maintenance
- 15 of fire-fighting facilities to perform all fire-fighting
- 16 activities within the district; or [and]
- 17 . (3) for the protection, preservation, and restoration
- 18 of the purity and sanitary condition of water within the district.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 65.015, Water Code, is amended to read as
- 20 follows:
- Sec. 65.015. CONTENTS OF RESOLUTION. In addition to the
- 22 requirements stated in Section 65.014, the resolution shall:
- 23 (1) describe the boundaries of the proposed district
- 24 by metes and bounds or by lot and block number, if there is a

- 1 recorded map or plat and survey of the area, or by any other
- 2 commonly recognized means in a certificate attached to the
- 3 resolution executed by a registered professional engineer;
- 4 (2) state the general nature of the services presently
- 5 performed by the water supply or sewer service corporation, the
- 6 general nature of the services proposed to be provided by the
- 7 district, and the necessity for the services provided by the
- 8 district;
- 9 (3) include a name of the district that is generally
- 10 descriptive of the location of the district followed by the words
- 11 special utility district, but may not be the same name as any other
- 12 district in the same county; [and]
- 13 (4) include the names of not less than five and not
- 14 more than 11 qualified persons to serve as the initial board of
- 15 directors of the district; and
- 16 (5) specify each purpose for which the district is
- 17 <u>being established</u>.
- 18 SECTION 3. (a) This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 19 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 20 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 21 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 23 (b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 65.015,
- 24 Water Code, applies to a certified resolution filed on or after
- 25 September 1, 2001.
