1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to developmental education and the assessment of student
- 3 readiness under the Texas Success Initiative and to students
- 4 enrolled in developmental education at public institutions of
- 5 higher education.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 51.3062, Education Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Subsections (a-1), (i-2), (i-3), and (i-4) and amending
- 9 Subsections (f), (i), and (k) to read as follows:
- 10 (a-1) In this section, "program evaluation" means a
- 11 systematic method of collecting, analyzing, and using information
- 12 to answer questions about developmental education courses,
- 13 interventions, and policies, particularly about their
- 14 effectiveness and cost-efficiency.
- 15 (f) Each assessment instrument designated by the board for
- 16 use under this section must be diagnostic in nature and designed to
- 17 assess a student's readiness to perform freshman-level academic
- 18 coursework. The board shall prescribe a single standard or set of
- 19 standards for each [the] assessment instrument to effectively
- 20 measure_student_readiness as demonstrated by current research [ex
- 21 instruments that reflect that student readiness. An institution of
- 22 higher education may adopt more stringent assessment standards with
- 23 respect to student readiness].
- 24 (i) The institution of higher education may refer a student

developmental coursework as considered necessary by the 1 2 institution to address a student's deficiencies in the student's readiness to perform freshman-level academic coursework, except 3 that the institution may not require enrollment in developmental 5 coursework with respect to a student previously determined under 6 Subsection (q-1) or determined by any institution of higher 7 education to have met college-readiness standards. An institution 8 that requires a student to enroll in developmental coursework must offer a range of developmental coursework, including online 9 10 coursework, or instructional support that includes the integration 11 of technology to efficiently address the particular developmental 12 needs of the student. 13 (i-2) An institution of higher education must base developmental coursework on research-based best practices that 14 15 include the following components: (1) assessment; 16 17 (2) differentiated placement and instruction; 18 (3) faculty development; 19 (4) support services; (5) program evaluation; 20 (6) integration of technology with an emphasis on 21 22 instructional support programs; 23 (7) non-course-based developmental education 24 interventions; and 25 (8) course pairing of developmental education courses with <u>credit-bearing courses</u>. 26

(i-3) The board shall adopt rules for the implementation of

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- 1 Subsection (i-2).
- 2 (i-4) The board, in consultation with institutions of
- 3 higher education, shall develop and provide professional
- 4 development programs, including instruction in differentiated
- 5 instruction methods designed to address students' diverse learning
- 6 needs, to faculty and staff who provide developmental coursework to
- 7 students.
- 8 (k) An institution of higher education shall determine when
- 9 a student is ready to perform freshman-level academic coursework.
- 10 The institution must make its determination using learning outcomes
- 11 for developmental education courses developed by the board based on
- 12 established college and career readiness standards and student
- 13 performance on one or more appropriate assessments [en an
- 14 individual basis according to the needs of the student. The
- 15 determination shall include:
- 16 [(1) requiring a student to retake a board-approved
- 17 assessment instrument, if the student did not initially perform
- 18 within a deviation established by the board; or
- 19 [(2) other board-approved means of evaluating student
- 20 readiness, if the student did not initially pass the assessment
- 21 instrument but performed within a deviation established by the
- 22 board].
- SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 54.225 to read as follows:
- 25 <u>Sec. 54.225. STUDENTS ENROLLED IN NON-SEMESTER-LENGTH</u>
- 26 DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION INTERVENTIONS. The governing board of an
- 27 institution of higher education may exempt from the payment of

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- 1 tuition authorized by this chapter a student who is participating
- 2 in an approved non-semester-length developmental education
- 3 intervention (including course-based, non-course-based,
- 4 alternative-entry/exit, and other intensive developmental
- 5 <u>education activities</u>).
- 6 · SECTION 3. Section 51.3062(e), Education Code, is repealed.
- 7 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 8 beginning with the 2012-2013 academic year.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
