

### **November 8. 1775**

Washington seeks to resolve several problems facing the army: how to encourage experienced troops to enlist; how to assemble a capable officer corps; and how to overcome provincial differences and rivalries. He writes, "Connecticut wants no Massachusetts man in her corps. Massachusetts thinks there is no necessity for a Rhode Islander. . . ."

### **November 10. 1775**

The official birthday of the [United States Marine Corps](#) is on 10 November 1775. That was the day when the [Second Continental Congress](#) established the [Continental Marines](#)

### **November 28. 1775**

Congress establishes the American Navy.

### **November 15, 1777**

Congress adopts the Articles of Confederation and Perpetual Union. The **Perpetual Union** is a feature of the Articles of Confederation and **Perpetual Union**, which established the **United States of America** as a national entity

### **November 17, 1777**

Congress submits the Articles of Confederation to the states for ratification.

### **November 3, 1783**

The Continental Army disbands.

### **November 25, 1783**

The British army evacuates from New York City, their last military position in the United States during the war
