A member of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York and the Pacific Council on Foreign Policy in San Francisco, Pitts is a long-time Amnesty International activist along with advising and publishing for numerous other organizations.

Colleges and departments, faculty, staff, and students are especially invited to support international education and scholarship efforts at UNT by sponsorship and attendance at the banquet.
