

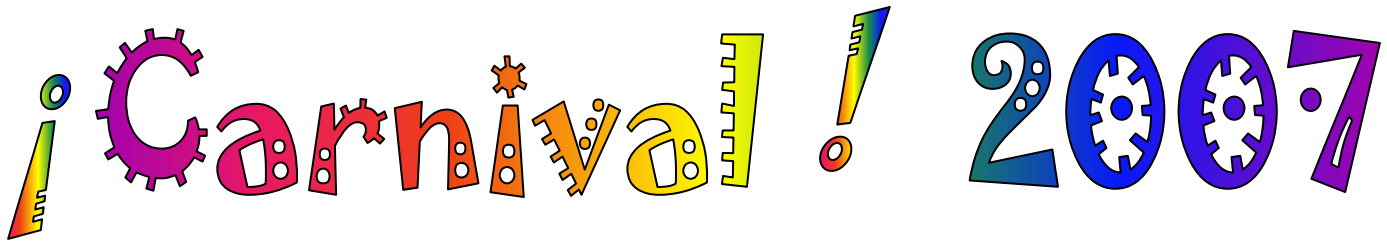

Get involved or volunteer your organization or department to sponsor a booth. Booth sponsor will be responsible for putting a booth together for the country of their choice. Booth information should include information about the country's history, traditions, holidays, culture, arts and myths. Booth sponsors will provide volunteers to work the booths and stamp passports for participants.

Participants will visit each of the booths and learn about the country before having their "passport" stamped. Once the passport is complete it becomes their ticket to enter a drawing for free stuff!

### Activities

**Culture Bee:** Participants answer Hispanic Cultural questions handed out at each country's booth to win.

**Dance Lessons and Contest:** Participants dance their way to UNT fame dancing to Latin music!

- people, government, industry

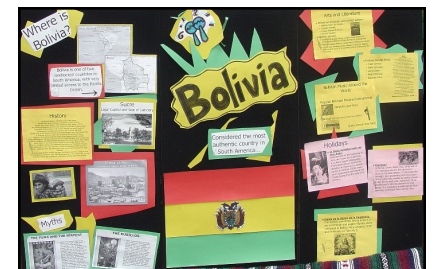
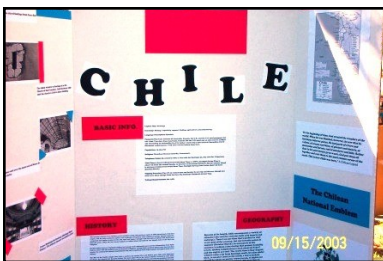
The information can be displayed in any way, shape, or form that is within university guidelines and tasteful. Sorry, no food is allowed to be served.
