Clarice Tinsley

Clarice Tinsley is proud to call Dallas-Fort Worth and KDFW FOX 4 her two homes for 26 years. Clarice was born in Detroit and fell in love with journalism in the 5th grade. She graduated from Wayne State University in three years with a B.A. in Radio, Television, and Film, and a double minor in Journalism and Humanities.

Six months after graduation Clarice moved to Milwaukee to join WITI-TV as a reporter. She worked there 3-1/2 wonderful years — working six days a week, co-anchoring the noon news weekdays and the Saturday evening news. Clarice also produced and co-hosted two public affairs shows.

In November 1978 Clarice moved to Dallas to accept a fantastic opportunity to anchor the 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. news at KDFW FOX 4. “It’s a job I’m proud to have. I’ve come into contact with fascinating people, and I’ve been privileged to cover memorable stories,” Clarice said. Clarice flew to Berlin and covered the fall of the Wall and its impact here in North Texas. In 1991 Clarice was the only local anchor to fly to Saudi Arabia and Kuwait to cover Texas troops in the Persian Gulf. In 1995 she flew to South America to cover the descendants of Confederate soldiers from the U.S. South who once a year create a tribute to their ancestors.

In 2001 Clarice was accepted into the second FBI Citizens Academy. The class would have begun on September 11, 2001. The events of that tragic day delayed the start of the class until 2003. In March the class started and Clarice reported on the 8 weeks of classes conducted by Special Agents of the Dallas FBI Office. Later that year, she had the flight of a lifetime. Clarice flew in the backseat of an F/A-18 Hornet with the Blue Angels. “I didn’t want it to end...loved every single second,” she said. “I pulled 7G’s and I didn’t get sick, I didn’t pass out and I didn’t throw up! Fly Navy!”

In 2004 Clarice had a rare assignment. She and photographer, Jeremy Pollard, flew to Quantico, Virginia, to cover new agent training at the FBI Academy. They covered fitness, academics, and weapons training as well as driving maneuvers designed to save the agents’ lives. A special treat, according to Clarice, was when she got to drive the FBI Skid Car.

Of the awards Clarice has won (including an Emmy and a Dupont-Columbia Citation), the one of which she is most proud is the George Foster Peabody Award. Clarice won it for a story she did about a Dallas man who called for an ambulance for his dying stepmother, and instead he got arguments and delays. The ambulance was dispatched after his third call to Dallas EMS. His stepmother had already died by then. Because of that story, Dallas’ EMS system changed the way it responds to medical emergencies.

In 2003 Baron James and Clarice Tinsley were named Best Anchor Team by the Dallas Press Club. In 2004 two of Clarice’s stories were recognized by the Dallas Press Club: “The Door” and “Blue Angle;” both took first place. That year she was honored to receive the J.B. Buck Marrayat Lifetime Achievement Award from the Dallas Press Club.

Clarice is married to the man of her dreams, Stephen Giles, and they have a super life. They love to acquire art, enjoy movies, plays, music, dancing, traveling, and having fun. Reading is one of Clarice’s passions and she loves to paint; acrylic on canvas. She volunteers at Reading Camp; Radio Resource and the books she reads on tape are distributed to 50,000 children in Texas who are blind or visually impaired.
