“Broken Spoke Red” and “Wobbly Wheel White” Delight the Palate and Support Lone Star Ride and Beneficiaries; Now Available at Select Whole Foods Markets and Beyond the Box

DALLAS: August 15, 2010 – Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS (LSRFA) presents a line of private label specialty wines now available at select area Whole Foods Markets and at Beyond the Box on Cedar Springs Road. Created by D’Vine Wine of Grapevine, Lone Star Wines are available in Broken Spoke Red and Wobbly Wheel White. Proceeds from the sale of every bottle go to support Lone Star Ride and its three beneficiary agencies that provide services to North Texans with HIV/AIDS.

Sebastian Gracki, D’Vine Wine’s general manager and Certified Specialist of Wine, oversees the entire winemaking process. He decided the best approach to bottling and distributing wines for the Lone Star Ride would be to use some of their more popular vintages. “We wanted to give people the ability to help out a good cause while rewarding them with a pleasant wine drinking experience that will leave them wanting more,” he said.

“Broken Spoke Red is a blend of two classic grapes,” says Gracki. “It’s 50 percent Cabernet Sauvignon and 50 percent Merlot. The brawny, muscular structure of Cabernet Sauvignon (cassis, black cherry, cedar box) intertwined with the plush, velvety notes of Merlot (chocolaty, plummy, soft and round) result in a perfectly balanced, medium-bodied red sipper.”

Gracki adds, “Wobbly Wheel White is 100 percent Pinot Grigio exhibiting aromas of apple and pear. On the palate, this wine is vibrant, fresh and juicy with citrus and melon leading to a strikingly crisp finish. It’s the perfect match for a little ceviche.”





DALLAS: August 20, 2010 – The Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS (LSRFA) will roll through Grand Prairie on Sunday, September 26, 2010. Lone Star Ride Supports North Texans with HIV/AIDS

Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS (LSRFA) is a two-day, fully supported bicycling event that raises money for three North Texas agencies supporting people impacted by HIV/AIDS. Since 2001, LSRFA has distributed more than \$1.8 million to its beneficiaries: AIDS Outreach Center of Tarrant County, AIDS Services of Dallas and Resource Center Dallas. The 10th LSRFA rides out September 25-26, 2010 and we are working hard to increase riders and raise more for our beneficiaries. The money our beneficiaries receive is non-designated funding, meaning they can use it according to their needs. This is a huge benefit to them because many of their other funding sources require the agencies to use the money for specific designated purpose.

As a fully supported ride, LSRFA features entertaining pit stops every 10 to 15 miles, which provide snacks, beverages, bike-tech support and even massage. Route crews provide support to riders on the road and can take riders back to camp if they decide to stop along the way. For the 10th anniversary ride we are planning an exceptional event. To encourage more cyclists and raise more money, LSRFA is offering multiple riding options, allowing participants to choose 45, 75 or 100 mile routes during the ride. With a crew doing everything to support riders, we want to make this an enjoyable and memorable experi-

ence for any level of cyclist.

Last year, LSRFA presented AOC, ASD and RCD with checks totaling \$100,000. With the economy in recession and federal dollars for HIV/AIDS services dwindling, the money raised by LSRFA is more important than ever. Each agency uses money from LSRFA according to its particular focus and the needs of its clients.

As an example of how money raised by LSRFA is used, in 2009 AOC served 90,860 meals to 800 clients at a cost of \$2.29 per meal. With \$500, the minimum required fund raising amount for LSRFA riders, AOC can serve approximately 230 meals.

ASD serves over 48,000 meals annually at a cost of \$8.35 per meal, meaning if a Lone Star Rider raises \$750.00, he or she enables ASD to put 90 nutritious meals on the table for its residents. Case management is another important service ASD offers residents. Case managers provide a variety of services such as job counseling, assistance to receive benefits, needs assessment and a sympathetic ear and strong shoulder when the day-to-day living with HIV/AIDS becomes overwhelming. ASD provided 11,341 sessions of case management services to its residents in 2009 at a cost of \$20.61 per session. So \$1,000 raised through LSRFA enables ASD to provide nearly 50 sessions of this vital service to its resi-

dents.

Two of RCD's most utilized and important programs are its meals and food pantry and dental clinics. For 2009-2010, the meals/pantry cost RCD \$548,322 and dental services cost \$746,503. The money raised from LSRFA helps RCD keep these vital programs operating, allowing them to serve thousands of people with HIV/AIDS in the community.

While the minimum fundraising goal for riders is \$500, the average Lone Star Rider raises \$1,400. LSRFA makes fundraising fun and simple, including providing a personal fundraising page from which riders can launch fundraising email campaigns to their families, friends and coworkers. This year we are also using the boundlessFUNDRAISING™ application which allows or riders to fundraise via Facebook. LSRFA offers fundraising clinics to provide tips that allow anyone to easily meet their fundraising goal.

LSRFA provides an exciting bicycling tour through the back roads of Dallas/Fort Worth, as well as offering riders and crew the opportunity to make new friends and help North Texans impacted by HIV/AIDS. Guess that is it for this month. Remember to ride carefully and watch out for Bubba.




