

Saluting past suits him

McKinney: Retired judge spends year as leader of the Sons of American Revolution

Now that his year as president general of the Sons of the American Revolution has come to a close, retired state district Judge Nathan White Jr. can't help thinking back to those 12 months he held the reins of the 26,000-member group whose members trace their ancestries to the rev-

"We're going to miss the many oppor-tunities we had," said Judge White. "My wife, Wanda, and I met a lot of interesting

people along the way."
Highlights included meeting with
President Bush in the Oval Office on May

"He's a member of the SAR, and we presented him with a medallion of the 400th anniversary of the settlement at Jamestown, Judge White said.

Judge White, a McKinney resident, also met the governors of Idaho and Utah, as well as mayors of cities he visited as president general.

His year was not without its challeng-

*Our executive director resigned, and we had to hire some new personnel," he said. "Also, we raised money to build a center for advancing America's heritage. It's a \$6 million project."

He began his year as president general at the SAR's 116th congress in Dallas on July 11, 2006. It ended at this year's convention in Williamsburg, Va. Judge White traveled to 26 states and 50 events.

This was not the first time Judge White has been in charge of an organization.

"I have been president or chairman or presiding officer or in charge of some 33 organizations since I was president of the Plano Senior High School Class of 1960," he said. "I was 18 then, and I am 65 years

old now. The leadership skills are some— Did he always plan to lead the way? "I didn't have aspirations," he said. "Every-thing just fell into place. It's where preparation meets opportunity.

Those who know him best are not surprised he has taken the lead so many

"He's not a shrinking violet," said Judge White's friend, Collin County Probate Court Judge Weldon Copeland. "He doesn't just belong to an organization. He gets in and works with it."

William Walker has known Judge White since the two founded the McKinney SAR chapter together more than a de-cade ago. He agreed with Judge Copeland that Judge White is a go-getter.

"I am not surprised that Nathan became president general," said Mr. Walker. 'He's very dynamic and always in mo-
