



During 2019 the McKinney Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution presented many outstanding programs that inspired, honored and educated our Compatriot members and guests.







Foster writes not only about their time in the war, but also gives an idea of who they were before. "My main reason for writing the book is because of my buddy Bill Bryan," Foster said. "A few years ago, I ran across an old friend from high school and my friend told me he remembered Bill and me joining the Marines together. Then he asked me what happened to Bill, and I had to tell him that Bill died back in Vietnam.

It's very important to me that I tell these guys stories because I know they won't be forgotten. Really there wasn't a lot to tell because they died so young, though. They grew up, went to high school, joined the military and that was it. I didn't want to just tell their war stories but a little bit about who they were before."








Guest Speaker: Nathan White, FPG, introduced our guest speaker Donald Graves, USMC, retired. Don was on Iwo Jima, and more specifically to his story, Mount Suribachi during WWII. Don was close to the US Flag raising event that took place on top of the mountain. After an introduction by Don's assistant Paul Swartz and a short video from a local TV station about Don, he spoke to the audience about his life and the impact WWII had on it. Don talked









about the circumstances surrounding the raising of the flag on Mount Suribachi, and the Japanese response. He discussed how the flag was actually replaced by another flag. Don talked about the strategic importance of capturing this island to the United States and the lives that were saved as a result. Don also remembered the 7,000 Marines that died during the island's capture. He spoke of his initial landing on the island as a flamethrower carrying a 70pound gasoline container on his back. When he literally hit the beach face down in the black sand he told God if he would let him survive, he would follow him for the rest of his life. He recalled multiple instances he experienced while capturing the island one of which resulted in him cursing God. When the 600-man company that Don was a part at landing left the island, there were only 17 survivors! One-third of all the Marines killed in WWII were killed on Iwo Jima. After the War, Don discussed how his life and marriage were in shambles until he went to a Billy Graham meeting where he remembered the pledge he made of God on that black Iwo Jima beach. He turned his life around, repaired his marriage, they were for 70 years separated only by her death, and became a minister. He closed by leading the audience in the song "God Bless America".

Don was close to the US Flag raising event that took place on top of the mountain. Don



spoke to the audience about his life and the impact WWII had on it. Don talked about the circumstances surrounding the raising of the flag on Mount Suribachi, and the Japanese response. He talked about the strategic importance of capturing this island to the United States and the lives that were saved as a result.



























Program:

Our speaker for this evening was Chris Earnest, Special Agent. Chris is the North Texas Training Coordinator of the Texas Department of Public Safety. He briefed the audience on the Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course. This course is designed and built on the Avoid, Deny, Defend (ADD) strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004, provides strategies, guidance, and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event. Topics include the history and prevalence of active shooter events, civilian response options, medical issues, and considerations for conducting drills. In the past two decades, horrific mass shootings have been thrust into public consciousness. Mitigating the effects of these sudden incidents is the responsibility of those who serve in our communities' public safety organizations. The public expects an effective and swift response to these threats and the sequence of events that follow them. Research has shown, however, that many of the mass attacks, or active attacks, are over before law enforcement responders



arrive on the scene. Civilians who find themselves embroiled in such an event must be prepared to take immediate action to save their own lives before law enforcement arrives. The average response time for police response to an active attack event is three minutes. Without effective, pre-planned response options for civilians at the scene of the attack, many victims can be seriously injured or killed during these three minutes. Chris provided our group with statistics of Active Attack Event along with the Avoid, Deny, Defend (ADD) strategy to maximize probability of survival during the critical time before first responders arrive on scene.

He then discussed the formation of our government by our founding fathers including the three branches of government as documented in the Constitution. Doug then talked about his role as a police chief within this framework.


