Could this be Miss Heaney? Dr. Alfred G. Heaney came in 1884.

M. Headen & Son general merchandise store

Mr. C of C. C." could this possibly be Charles Carroll, in the Myrtle Club see Dec. 21, 1884. It could, of course, also be Robert's good friend W. P. Carruthers, who had earlier visited the King Ranch. (August 9, 1884)

Sister's recovery Do not know which sister (must live in Cuero) or what the illness was. (August 9, 1884)

Miss M (Dec. 11, 1884)

Mrs. Gosbesy [?] (Dec. 21, 1884)

Mr. Keenan (Dec. 21, 1884)

Collins Exposition—cannot find what this refers to. (March 29, 1885)

Maxwell —do not know who this is (August 21, 1885)

Mr. Geo. Fulton, wife & two young ladies from Rockport-(August 24, 1885)

Edwin E. Wilson—not known to authors. (September 4, 1885)

Leoncitos League on King Ranch—have not located this. (Sept. 9, 1885)

Miss [Hennie?]-not found. (Dec. 22, 1885)

Tonight[’s] entertainment—not found. (Dec. 22, 1885)

Ms. Mallory Ms. Mallorys’ —Is this Edwin Mallory’s wife, Mifflin’s secretary? (Jan. 22, 1886)

Moved into new rooms (Jan 22, 1886)

What “little trip” had Alice been on? To St. Louis? More likely to Corpus or to San Antonio? (Jan 22, 1886)

Mrs. D Hayney[?]Mrs. Heaney—7/25/87 (Jan 22, 1886)

CCS-p. 61—Dr. A. G. Heaney was one our most popular physicians. ?????

Miss Hessie??? Hennie?? (Jan. 22, 1886)

how long your friend is going to stay!” possibly some friend from school? (Jan 27, 1886)

Mr. ODocherty, unknown to authors. (Feb. 16, 1886)

collector of customs at Eagle Pass (Nov. 16, 1886)

my old room mate at Cuero of whom I have spoken so often, Mr. Gressen[?] little Luna’s[?] father

Rudolph’s little sister

Mr. James Hobbs (Aug. 17, 1887)

Herman Meuly operated a newsdealer, bookseller, and stationer business
James M. Hunter owner a livery and stable on Water Street
