Regarding the cultural/arts tour for June: There are no specific events during that week in Denton. We have many activities related to theatre and music all year. However, they are held during the rest of the year. With two universities, everyone here is on a September to May schedule!

What we do have during that week is a concert which is part of a series held every year during May and June. It's called Concerts on the Square and is a free public event held at noon. There is one on Wed., June 26. If you scheduled the tour to include Denton, that could work for a cultural offering. Then we have several museums we'd like to include:

Denton County Historical Museum (in the Courthouse on the Square)

Meadows Gallery in the Center for Visual Arts

The Ladies Gowns Museum at Texas Woman's University

The Rare Book Room at University of North Texas

The Pecan Museum (features all kinds of little characters especially celebrities made from pecans!)

I'd like to have the group come to Denton. If it works with the suggested itinerary, fine. If not, then I'll ask for a stop on a future media tour. Also, if you need an extra host for Wed. or Thurs. of this June tour, let me know.

Dear Maura:

Again, many thanks for the invitation to the Dallas/Fort Worth area. I appreciate the special trip to the Holocaust Museum and the opportunity to visit so many places I'd not seen before. I'm anticipating a lot of articles in a lot of publications.

You've asked for comments and suggestions, and I have several, based on years of "research" trips and working as a tour guide.

General suggestions and comments:

1. I think you have to decide what you think of as "culture" and what your guests think of as "culture." Personally, I see it as what is available in the visual and performing arts, including history and museums (and as noted later, eats) of the area, from country to classical, old to new. Perhaps the trip should be announced that way, or your invite list and itinerary more closely dovetailed. That way, those who associate only classical music and Old Masters paintings won't be included in a trip that includes a Concert on the Square and Johnny High's, etc.

2. I liked the little itinerary slip that went into the name badge. It should have been updated & replaced as the schedule changed.

3. I'd say you need one person who is with the trip from beginning to end. It's nice that someone from each area or attraction is on the bus, but a constant escort (as well) offers continuity. This means one person acts as a clearing house for questions, problems, and special requests. That person knows what the schedule is for the next day and can remind people about gathering times, dress, or whatever. Too many questions came up that were answered "I don't know about "wherever," my base is "here." [REDACTED]

Also, although almost everyone had an escort to the airport, the Abramsons (and I) didn't, and we didn't think to ask ahead which gate we should go to. This was a petty annoyance and we were at D/FW well ahead of our flight, but it's something that should have been pre-determined.

4. For me, the days started too late and ended too late. That was understandable for the night

at the Meyerson and Johnny High's. Photography is best done in early morning and late afternoon and mid-day is terrible.

5. Spend less time in meals. Make the lunches box lunches or pre-determined menus (such as at Trail Dust). Pre-determine if you have vegetarians or other special dietary needs.

6. Thanks for shipping the stuff home. I could handle it, but it's nice not having to.

7. I think of BBQ when I think of Texas, and with such choices as Sonny Bryants, Bakers and Angelo's (plus all the others I've never tried), I think BBQ should be included. Or am I mistaken, and is BBQ not part of the D/FW culture?

Specific items regarding this "cultural" trip include:

1. The concert at Denton was delightful. The luncheon should have been a box lunch, eaten on the lawn while listening to it. Announce the day as one of relaxation and recovery from our flights. I enjoyed the Campus Theatre and the Ladies Gowns. I would liked to have seen the Pecan Museum. Was the Meadows Gallery/Center for Visual Arts the building we went to after the Campus?

5. Get more reliable and dependable transportation. All but the last vehicle were a disgrace. I write for convention publications occasionally, and there's no way I can recommend any of those bus companies. The vehicles had no springs, no brakes, no air conditioning, broken windshield, broken support pipes, and of course, no headlights.

6. For a cultural tour, I think there were a lot more things that could and should have been included. The ballet, all the museums/galleries in Fort Worth, the Science Center in Dallas, etc. If this isn't the season for them, then schedule the cultural trip for when they are in season.

7. I enjoyed the brew-pub and I've forwarded information about that to Sports Tours (800/722-7701) the baseball tour people, for their next D/FW visit.

In all, despite these comments, I enjoyed the trip. The organization and planning have shown considerable improvement over the last trip I was on, in April of 1993. Keep up the good work. Of course, I'll send clips as they are printed. Have a grand summer, and please feel free to call if you'll be in this area. That's an invitation to each of you.

## The Collection

The pioneer spirit of frontier Texas...the graceful lifestyle of the antebellum South...the robust growth of the Lone Star State from wagon trains to railroads to space ships...the aura of special occasions at the White House...the election of the first woman governor of Texas.

These historic periods are represented in the authentic Collection of Gowns of the First Ladies of Texas on display at Texas Woman's University.

This collection, the only one in existence, includes either the actual garments or faithful copies of the gowns worn by the wives of the governors of Texas and presidents of the Republic of Texas. In addition, the collection includes dresses worn at formal events at the White House by the wives of two presidents of the United States and the wife of a vice president of the United States.

The collection was created by the late Dr. Marion Day Mullins, a noted genealogist, historian, club woman and civic leader. It was assembled by the Texas Society of the Daughters of the American



Revolution during Dr. Mullins' two-year term as State Regent of the organization. In 1940, she presented the collection to TWU on behalf of the DAR.

A life-size wax figure of Dr. Mullins has been placed in a separate case at the entrance to the museum as a memorial to her service to the DAR and the State of Texas, and her commitment



to education and this collection of gowns.

Many thousands have visited the collection, and it is frequently used as a teaching and study resource for TWU students and faculty, public school classes and other groups interested in the authentic garments or copies of gowns worn by outstanding women since the founding of the Republic of Texas in 1836.

## Accessions

The collection has grown steadily because of the generosity of individuals who have donated and lent items and funds to it. Since it was installed in 1940, relatives and descendants of presidents and governors, friends of TWU and members of the state DAR at large, and especially the Denton and Fort Worth Chapters, have both enlarged and updated the collection.

## Location

The collection is located on the ground floor of the Human Development Building on the TWU campus in Denton. Handicap access is available. Please call for information.

## Admission and Hours

Visitors are admitted free of charge.

The collection is open by appointment only. Call 898-3201 for appointments.
