

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PREFACE

The Texas Department of Water Resources Library Bulletin is a monthly list of new acquisitions added to the Library collection during the month. The <u>Bulletin</u> is produced by the computer from the same computerized data base used to produce the microfiche catalogs Each new acquisition appears under only one broad subject category Arrangement within the subject categories is by call number Each entry shows the author, title, and bibliographic information

The <u>Bulletin</u> is made available to staff members of the Texas Department of Water Resources, as well as to other state agencies, firms, and individuals, with the goal of providing maximum user access to all publications housed in the Library, and serving as a current awareness tool

Titles include work done by water resources centers, state and federal agencies in water allied fields, consultant reports, conferences and symposia, and trade books. Subject matter is in the field of water, often reflecting a broader interdisciplinary scope, including material on public policy issues; social, environmental and biological implications of water consumption and pollution; land use; water resources development; remote sensing; weather; and energy
