There has also been a wide-spread outbreak of sore throats throughout the state. Reports of epidemics of septic sore throat have been made from some sections. EPI NOTES

Infant Botulism: Two infant botulism cases were reported in January -- a 26-day-old boy and a 20day-old girl. The infants reside in Tyler and Devine, respectively. Neither had a history of consuming honey or corn syrup. Although the girl is still hospitalized, both infants are recovering.

Pseudomonas Outbreak: Seven cases of Pseudomonas folliculitis were associated with a hot tub at an Austin hotel. The cases used the tub during the weekend of February 2-4, 1990.

Influenza Update: Influenza virus activity is decreasing in Texas. Influenza A (H3N2) strains have been the predominant viruses, although influenza A (HINI) and B strains have been reported.

EMS Update: A total of 72 cases of cosinophiliamyalgia syndrome have been identified in Texas. None have died. Although case-control studies have associated this syndrome with ingestion of L-tryptophan, no contaminant has been identified in samples tested. The cause of this syndrome remains unknown.

Guanabana Juice-associated Illness: Texas Department of Health Food and Drug Division and the Bureau of Disease Control and Epidemiology are investigating reports of illness associated with guanabana juice imported from Mexico. Most reports have come from persons who obtained the juice from food banks. The illness has been characterized by the rapid onset (15 minutes to 1 hours) of nausea and vomiting followed by a speedy and complete recovery. Scombroid Food Poisoning: On February 18, an emergency room physician in Austin identified and reported a case of scombroid food poisoning. Although the patient stated he had ordered and caten a swordfish sandwich, the fish was subsequently identified as marlin. An investiwas conducted by the Austin-Travis County Health Department with assistance from TDH and the US Food and Drug Administration. Preliminary results indicate that the fish, originally shipped from Florida, reached the local distributor on February 9, the restaurant on February 12, and the consumer on February 18. Elevated levels of histamine were found in a sample of fish obtained from the restaurant. Since then, the local distributor has been inspected and is in the process of obtaining a distributor's permit. TDH Food and Drug officials will be cooperating with Florida officials to determine the source of the marlin.
