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DEPARTMENT PROPOSES FISHERIES CHANGES

AUSTIN--Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials are proposing statewide changes for yellow bass, flathead catfish and netting in public freshwater as well as several other changes. There are no proposed changes in wildlife regulations.

Proposed changes were made to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission on Jan. 23. Phil Durocher, TPWD inland fisheries chief, gave outdoor writers a preview of scheduled changes at the Texas Outdoor Writers Association's annual meeting in Killeen.

The most notable change will increase the statewide minimum size limit on flathead catfish from nine inches to 24 inches. Durocher said these fish need to be treated differently from channel and blue catfish.

A recent survey of 250 flatheads indicated this popular sport fish lives 25 years or longer and can reach weights of more than 100 pounds. But flatheads don't reach maturity until they are two to four years old, usually measuring 17 inches to 26 inches. A one year old flathead will measure about 12 inches.

"The nine-inch minimum protects no flathead catfish to maturity," Durocher said. "A nine-inch flathead only weighs one-third of a pound. For maximum sustained yield, we must protect them till maturity." A 24-inch flathead will weigh about 6 1/2 pounds.

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The proposal should protect 50 percent of the population to maturity.

Another proposal will remove the current bag limit (25 daily, 50 in possession) on yellow bass. The commission removed the minimum size limit last year.

The department also is proposing a prohibition on the use of gill, trammel and hoop nets in public freshwater. If approved this measure would become effective Sept. 1, 1993, in order to give any remaining netters time to find other occupations.

"We're not against selling rough fish," Durocher said. "We are against nets. They catch and kill fish indiscriminately."

Other proposed fisheries changes include:

* Joe Pool Reservoir - change the current 18-inch minimum, three fish daily bag limit on black bass to a 14- to 21-inch slot limit and three fish daily limit;

* Lake Meredith - place a 12- to 15-inch slot limit on smallmouth bass;

* Choke Canyon - reduce the crappie bag limit from 25 per day to 15;

* Purtis Creek State Park Lake - retain catch and release on black bass but allow anglers to retain one bass longer than 22 inches in a live well or other aerated holding device for transportation to a park weigh station. After weighing, it must be immediately released back into the lake or it may be donated to Operation Share A Lone Star Lunker;

* Lakeview City Park Lake in Corpus Christi, and Lake Burke-Crenshaw in Pasadena - designates these lakes as freshwater for regulation purposes;

* Nelson Park Lake in Abilene, and Buck Lake in South Llano River State Park - catch and release only for largemouth bass;

* Lake Burke-Crenshaw - places a 14- to 18-inch slot limit on black bass;

* Bright Lake in Round Rock, Lake Burke-Crenshaw and Nelson Park Lake place a 14-inch minimum, five fish daily bag limit on channel and blue catfish;

* Lake Burke-Crenshaw and Bright Lake - prohibit the use of trotlines, juglines and throwlines;

* allow nongame fish taken by legal means and methods (shad trawl, seine, cast net, minnow trap and umbrella net) to be used for any purpose;

remove size restriction on dip nets;

* place a 16-inch minimum length limit, three fish daily bag on black bass at Lake Coleman and Lake Brownwood for experimental purposes;

* place a 12-inch minimum length limit on white bass in Lakes Conroe, Livingston, Limestone, Palestine and Somerville and the rivers above these lakes for experimental purposes. The 10-inch limit protects them for only one year and many are being harvested before they spawn;

* place the experimental catfish limit of 14-inch minimum length and 15 fish daily bag on Lakes Choke Canyon, Cooper, Fairfield and O.H. Ivie;

* place an experimental seven-inch minimum length and 25 fish daily bag limit on sunfish in Purtis Creek State Park Lake;

* change the possession limit on all fish to twice the daily bag limit for simplification. This will affect greater amberjack, cobia, king mackerel, Spanish mackerel, sharks and red snapper;

* increase the Spanish mackerel bag limit from three per day to seven per day;

* permit the use of sail lines to take sharks.

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Public hearings are being scheduled for March 2-6 in 39 locations. All meetings will begin at 7 p.m. The exact location in these cities will be announced once they are finalized.

Towns scheduled to have regulatory public hearings are: Abilene, Amarillo, Alpine, Austin, Beaumont, Big Spring, Brenham, Brownsville, Brownwood, Bryan, Corpus Christi, El Paso (MST), Galveston, Grand Prairie, Houston, Huntsville, Jasper, Kerrville, Laredo, Livingston, Lubbock, Lufkin, Marshall, McAllen, Midland, Nacogdoches, New Boston, Orange, Port Lavaca, Rio Grande City, San Angelo, San Antonio, Sherman, Three Rivers, Tyler, Uvalde, Victoria, Waco and Wichita Falls.

If approved, all of the proposals except netting in public freshwater will go into effect Sept. 1

TEAL SEASON, DOVE LIMITS PROPOSED

AUSTIN--Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials were scheduled to request a teal season as part of the proposed 1992-93 early season migratory game bird proclamation presented to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission on Jan. 23.

Department officials also will meet publicly with federal officials Jan. 28-29 to discuss migratory game birds.

They will meet at 2 p.m. on Jan. 28 at the J.D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area near Port Arthur for an informal meeting and tour of the area.

From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Jan. 29, officials will meet in the Cloud Room at Houston Hobby Airport to discuss the state and federal migratory game bird hunting regulatory process and a proposed nationwide migratory hunting permit. The permit would be similar to the federal duck stamp but would be required to hunt all species of migratory game nationwide.

The department currently proposes a nine-day statewide teal season for Sept. 19-27 Bag limit would be four per day, eight in possession. The September teal season has been closed since 1988 because of concerns about poor production caused by extended drought conditions on the breeding grounds. However, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service went on record in June 1990 that it considers September teal seasons to be an acceptable harvest management strategy.

A four-day white-winged dove season also was proposed for the Special White-winged Dove Area, up from two days the previous year Proposed dates are Sept. 5-6 and 12-13. Daily bag limit would be: south of Del Rio - 10 white-winged, mourning and white-tipped doves in the aggregate, including no more than five mourning doves and two white-tipped doves; and north of Del Rio - 10 whitewings, mourning and whitetips in the aggregate, including no more than two white-tipped doves per day.

Proposed mourning dove dates are: North Zone, Sept. 1-Nov. 9; Central Zone, Sept. 1-Oct. 30 and Jan. 1-10; and South Zone, Sept. 20-Nov. 11 (ends Nov. 7 in Special White-winged Dove Area) and Jan. 1-17 The proposed statewide daily bag limit is 12 mourning, white-winged and white-tipped doves in the aggregate, including no more than six white-winged and two white-tipped doves. Possession limit will be twice the daily bag.

The department is proposing to increase the daily bag limit on white-winged doves during the regular mourning dove season from two daily to six in a four-county area in the Lower Rio Grande Valley. Affected counties include Cameron, Hidalgo, Starr and Willacy. Ron George, program leader for migratory, shore and upland game birds, said the current requirement is overly restrictive and unnecessarily complicates Texas hunting regulations.

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Other proposed season dates and bag limits include: rails, Sept. 1-Nov. 9, king and clapper rails 15 per day, 30 in possession, and Sora and Virginia rails, 25 daily and in possession; and gallinules, Sept. 1-Nov. 9, bag limit 15 daily and 30 in possession. There is no open season on red-billed pigeons, band-tailed pigeons and shorebirds.

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If approved by state and federal officials, the regulations would be in effect Sept. 1

COMMISSION CHAIRMAN SPEAKS TO WRITERS

KILLEEN--Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission chairman Ygnacio Garza is impressed with the diversity of issues he and his fellow commissioners deal with. Garza is just completing a whirlwind first year on the commission, the past 3 1/2 months as chairman.

Garza, former mayor of Brownsville, discussed his first year on the job and what sportsmen can expect in the future with members of the media Jan. 17 at the Texas Outdoor Writers Association annual meeting in Killeen.

"I'm impressed with the important issues we deal with, such as the Edwards Aquifer, oysters, the release of exotic shrimp and the list goes on," he said. "As Texans we are blessed that we have a diversity of habitats. Our role on the commission and at the Parks and Wildlife Department is to enhance and protect and preserve the natural resources for the people of the state of Texas."

One of the biggest issues facing the department in the future involves money. Garza said TPWD needs to identify new sources of revenue to buy more land for parks because park visitors are our biggest constituent in sheer numbers. About 24 million people visited state parks in 1991

After receiving a request by the Sierra Club to make mountain lions a protected nongame species, the department will deal with that issue this year "Personally, we don't have the data to enact emergency regulations but lions probably deserve more protection than they're getting now," Garza said.

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The department will continue to study the East Texas deer herd, waterfowl season dates and bag limits, grass carp and a continued increase in production in our hatcheries.

Garza also was concerned about hunting accidents and a decrease in the number of Texas hunters.

"I never knew the extent of hunting accidents in Texas. I'm surprised at the deaths and accidents this year, although I understand this has been an average year," he said. "I'm concerned the anti-hunters will use these figures as ammunition. I'm concerned from a safety standpoint; we need to look at the causes. We need to find an answer. Is it hunter orange, increased education or what?

"We've had a 3 percent decline trend in the number of hunters in this state. We need to find out the factors, whether they're cost or access or something else. I want to make sure we have hunters and fishermen because I enjoy it, but we also need that money from licenses for programs."

Garza also praised landowners. "The success of Texas Parks and Wildlife to manage wildlife has been our ability to work with landowners. Without them letting us in there, we couldn't do the studies we need to do."

In the coming year, Garza said he will create a landowner committee and a park committee, both to be similar to the Freshwater Advisory Board.

In a related note, chairman emeritus Perry R. Bass of Fort Worth was named winner of the Citizen Conservationist of the Year Award by the writer's group.

Last summer, Bass was responsible for convincing state officials to deposit \$400,000 in annual interest on hunting and fishing license monies in Fund 9. He served on the commission for six years beginning in 1977, serving as chairman in 1979.

He has been responsible in the past for many significant legislative acts for conservation of the natural resources of Texas, including the Wildlife Conservation Act, the Red Drum Act, the Local Parks, Recreation and Open Space Fund and management of the Matagorda Island State Park and Wildlife Management Area.

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TAGGED SHARKS RECAPTURED IN MEXICO

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AUSTIN--Two sharks, tagged and released a month apart by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department coastal fisheries personnel, were caught several months later in waters off Matamoros, Mexico. Ironically, the fish were caught by the same angler, Pedro Gonzalez Silva of Matamoros, only 13 days apart.

In May, Drew Jenkins, a fish and wildlife technician from Port O'Connor, tagged and released a 21-inch blacktip shark in the Gulf surf off Matagorda Island. Six months later Silva recaptured the shark - by then it weighed 9 pounds - near Matamoros.

In June, Mark Kelley, also a fish and wildlife technician in Port O'Connor, tagged and released a 22-inch bonnethead shark near where the blacktip was released. Silva recaptured the bonnethead five months later in the same area the blacktip was caught.

Jenkins and Kelley were participating in a National Marine Fisheries Service-sponsored shark tagging program. The program is a cooperative effort among volunteer sport and commercial fishermen and participating scientists, Jenkins said. The program is designed to increase scientists' knowledge of shark biology, growth and migration patterns.

Since 1988, Kelley said, 11 sharks tagged in Texas have been recaptured, seven from Mexican waters. Unfortunately, the exact location and size of these two sharks at recapture were not clearly identified. Anglers catching tagged sharks or other tagged fish are asked to record the size and location of capture as accurately as possible.

If you catch a tagged shark, measure the fork length; record the tag number and recapture details (date, location, sex, etc.); remove a six- to 10-inch piece of backbone from over the gills; freeze the backbone overnight or pickle in rubbing alcohol; double wrap in plastic bags and airmail to Attn: Shark Project, Open Immediately, National Marine Fisheries Service, Narragansett, R.I., 02882. 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FEDERAL KING MACKEREL BAG REDUCED TO ZERO

AUSTIN--Recreational fishing for king mackerel in federal waters was closed at midnight Jan. 12 by the National Marine Fisheries Service. The bag limit will remain zero until July 1

The season was closed because the 3.9 million-pound recreational fishery quota was reached. The commercial quota of 1.8 million pounds was reached last fall.

The state limit of two king mackerel per day is still in effect, said Ralph Rayburn, chief of the coastal fisheries branch at the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. The department has no plans to adjust the bag limit in state waters.

"This ruling will have more of an impact in the spring when the fish come back," he said. Most king mackerel are wintering farther south.

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THREE STATE FISH RECORDS SET

AUSTIN--The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department has certified a guaguanche, a lizardfish and an Atlantic stingray as new state records.

Louis Alexander Kusey III of Port Aransas caught a 1.7-pound guaguanche Nov. 10, 70 miles south of Port Aransas. The fish measured 20.75 inches long. Michael Horton of Houston held the previous record of 1.33 pounds caught Dec. 31, 1985.

San Antonio angler Winnie Poff caught a 1.85-pound, 20-inch lizardfish Oct. 20 in the Gulf of Mexico. The previous record of 15 ounces was caught by Charles Bailey of Hitchcock on Oct. 12, 1985.

A 36.25-inch Atlantic stingray weighing 5 pounds, 4 ounces was caught Aug. 10 by Justin Patterson of Hitchcock. The former record of 3 pounds, 12 ounces was caught May 21, 1988, by Bryan P. Ellis, also of Hitchcock. Ironically. Patterson lives on the same street in Hitchcock where Ellis lived when he caught his record.

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ANHEUSER-BUSCH GIVEN CONSERVATION AWARD

AUSTIN--The Texas Game Warden Association has named Anheuser-Busch, Inc. as the 1991 recipient of the Conservationist of the Year Award.

The award, presented annually by the 7,000-member statewide group, honors an individual or organization that has significantly contributed to conservation efforts in Texas. The award will be presented at the association's convention Feb. 16 in McAllen.

Anheuser-Busch's most noteworthy contribution of 1991 was a \$250,000 donation to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, the largest corporate donation in the agency's history. The funds went to the purchase of tour buses for Big Bend Ranch State Natural Area and Matagorda Island State Park, to the Operation Game Thief program and to the new Parks and Wildlife Foundation of Texas, Inc. The foundation is a non-profit organization established in May to help the department with its vast projects. The fund is a cornerstone for building a viable permanent partner in the private sector for the department.
