
6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Section 40.112, Natural Resources Code, is
8 amended to read as follows:


9 Sec. 40.112. ISSUANCE. On compliance with Sections 40.109
10 through 40.111 [~~of this code and on payment of the certificate~~
11 ~~application fee~~], the commissioner shall issue the applicant a
12 discharge prevention and response certificate covering the
13 terminal facility.

14 SECTION 2. Section 40.110(e), Natural Resources Code, is
15 repealed.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.



IN RE: **HB1481** by Lozano (Relating to the abolition of the fee established by the commissioner of the General Land Office for processing applications for terminal facility discharge prevention and response certificates.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Natural Resources Code to remove the requirement that the General Land Office (GLO) assess a fee to obtain a discharge prevention and response certificate for oil handling facilities. There are 575-600 oil handling facilities in Texas and they are certified for five-year periods, for which GLO assesses a \$25 fee. Based on the average certification fee revenue for fiscal years 2012 to 2016, GLO projects this bill will result in a revenue loss of \$3,260 per fiscal year. Based on the analysis of GLO and the Comptroller of Public accounts, the revenue loss resulting from the certification fee not being collected would not result in a significant fiscal impact.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
