
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 662, Government Code, is
6 amended by adding Section 662.065 to read as follows:


7 Sec. 662.065. LAW ENFORCEMENT APPRECIATION DAY. (a)
8 January 9 is Law Enforcement Appreciation Day.

9 (b) Law Enforcement Appreciation Day may be regularly
10 observed in public schools and other places. The Texas Education
11 Agency shall develop recommendations for the observation of Law
12 Enforcement Appreciation Day through appropriate activities in the
13 public schools.

14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.





IN RE: HB297 by Bell (Relating to the designation of January 9 as Law Enforcement Appreciation Day.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would add new Texas Government Code, Section 662.065, designating January 9th as Law Enforcement Appreciation Day. The bill would permit Law Enforcement Appreciation Day to be regularly observed in public schools and other places. Additionally, the bill would require the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to develop recommendations for the observation of Law Enforcement Appreciation Day through appropriate activities in public schools.

TEA would be required to develop recommendations for the observation of Law Enforcement Appreciation Day in public schools. There would be minor costs to the agency to develop and make available these recommendations, but there would be no significant fiscal impact.
