H.B. No. 1716

AN ACT

relating to territory of county assistance districts.


BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 387.003, Local Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:


(a) The commissioners court of the county may call an election on the question of creating a county assistance district under this chapter. More than one county assistance district may be created in a county. A district may consist of noncontiguous tracts.

(k) A district annexing territory under this section may annex territory that is not adjacent or contiguous to the district.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.







IN RE: HB1716 by Reynolds (Relating to territory of county assistance districts.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Local Government Code to specify that a county utility district may consist of noncontiguous tracts and allows these districts to annex territory that is not adjacent or contiguous.

According to the Secretary of State, the bill would have no anticipated significant fiscal implications. The agency could update any advisory materials within existing resources.

This bill would take effect September 1, 2017.
