3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 434.203, Government Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 434.203. COORDINATOR. (a) The executive director
7	shall designate a women veterans coordinator for this state.
8	(b) The coordinator or the coordinator's designee shall
9	serve as a liaison between state and federal agencies and
10	organizations that provide benefits and services to women veterans.
11	SECTION 2. Section 434.204, Government Code, is amended to
12	read as follows:
13	Sec. 434.204. GENERAL PROGRAM DUTIES. The program shall:
14	(1) provide assistance to the women veterans of this
15	state as provided by this subchapter;
16	(2) perform outreach functions to improve the
17	awareness of women veterans of their eligibility for federal and
18	state veterans' benefits and services;
19	(3) assess the needs of women veterans with respect to
20	benefits and services;
21	(4) review programs, research projects, and other
22	initiatives designed to address the needs of the women veterans of
23	this state;
24	(5) make recommendations to the executive director

- 2 veterans; [and]
- 3 (6) incorporate issues concerning women veterans in
- 4 commission planning regarding veterans' benefits and services; and
- 5 (7) in collaboration with appropriate state agencies,

- 7 provided by state or federal agencies and organizations to women
- 8 <u>veterans</u>.
- 9 SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 434, Government Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Sections 434.212, 434.213, and 434.214 to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 Sec. 434.212. WOMEN VETERANS REPORT. Not later than
- 13 November 1 of each even-numbered year, the commission shall submit
- 14 to the governor, lieutenant governor, and legislature a report on
- 15 women veterans in this state. The report may be delivered
- 16 electronically and must:
- 17 (1) estimate the:
- 18 (A) number of women veterans in this state;
- 19 (B) number of women veterans who contact the
- 20 commission for assistance; and
- (C) number of women veterans who receive
- 22 assistance from the commission, the Texas Workforce Commission, the
- 23 Department of State Health Services, and other state agencies;
- (2) identify the unique problems faced by women
- 25 veterans; and
- 26 (3) recommend policy proposals, initiatives, and
- 27 funding levels to address the problems identified in Subdivision

- Sec. 434.213. WOMEN VETERANS COMMUNITY OUTREACH CAMPAIGN.
- 3 The women veterans coordinator designated under Section 434.203, in
- 4 consultation with the Governor's Commission for Women, the United
- 5 States Department of Veterans Affairs, and any other appropriate
- 6 agency, shall conduct a community outreach campaign to:
- 7 (1) provide information relating to and increase
- 8 awareness of benefits and services available to women veterans;
- 9 (2) improve access to benefits and services for women
- 10 veterans;
- 11 (3) increase participation of women veterans in
- 12 programs that provide benefits and services;
- 13 (4) provide information on the significant
- 14 contributions of women veterans in this state; and
- 15 (5) provide information relating to and increase
- 16 awareness of support groups and other organizations relating to
- 17 family services, including services for women veterans who are
- 18 single parents.
- 19 Sec. 434.214. APPLICATION FOR STATE AGENCY PROGRAMS,
- 20 SERVICES, OR ASSISTANCE. (a) This section applies to a state
- 21 agency in the executive branch of state government, including a
- 22 health and human services agency, that provides to adult women in
- 23 this state a program, a service, or assistance, including the
- 24 Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, the supplemental
- 25 nutrition assistance program, the women's health program,
- 26 Medicaid, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women,
- 27 Infants, and Children, and a housing program or service or housing

- 1 <u>assistance</u>.
- 2 (b) A state agency shall include in each application for a
- 3 program, a service, or assistance provided by the agency to adult
- 4 women:
- 5 (1) a space to indicate whether the applicant is a
- 6 yeteran; and
- 7 (2) model language informing the applicant that she
- 8 may be entitled to additional services because of her veteran
- 9 status.
- 10 (c) The commission shall develop the model language
- 11 required on an application under Subsection (b)(2). The language
- 12 <u>must include</u> a link to the veterans website established <u>under</u>
- 13 Section 434.102 or, for an online application, a hyperlink to that
- 14 website.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 662, Government Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 662.065 to read as follows:
- Sec. 662.065. WOMEN VETERANS DAY. (a) June 12 is Women
- 18 Veterans Day to recognize the role of women in the military forces
- 19 and to commemorate the sacrifices of and valor displayed by Texas
- 20 women veterans.
- 21 (b) Women Veterans Day shall be regularly observed by
- 22 appropriate programs and activities.
- SECTION 5. Not later than November 1, 2018, the women
- 24 veterans coordinator shall establish the women veterans community
- 25 outreach campaign as required under Section 434.213, Government
- 26 Code, as added by this Act, and the Texas Veterans Commission shall
- 27 adopt any rules necessary to implement the campaign.

- 1 SECTION 6. (a) Not later than December 1, 2017, the Texas
- 2 Veterans Commission shall develop the model application language
- 3 required by Section 434.214, Government Code, as added by this Act,
- 4 and post that information on the commission's Internet website.
- 5 (b) Not later than March 1, 2018, each state agency subject
- 6 to Section 434.214, Government Code, as added by this Act, shall
- 7 modify the agency's application for programs, services, or
- 8 assistance as necessary to implement that section.
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
