5	SECTION 1. Section 382.018(d), Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(d) The commission may not control or prohibit outdoor
8	burning of waste consisting of trees, brush, grass, leaves, branch
9	trimmings, or other plant growth if:
10	(1) the person burning the waste is doing so at a site:
11	(A) designated for consolidated burning of waste
12	generated from specific residential properties;
13	(B) located in a county with a population of less
14	than 50,000;
15	(C) located outside of a municipality; and
16	(D) supervised at the time of the burning by <u>:</u>
17	<u>(i)</u> an employee of a fire department who is
18	part of the fire protection personnel, as defined by Section
19	419.021, Government Code, of the department and is acting in the
20	scope of the person's employment; or
21	(ii) a volunteer firefighter acting in the
22	scope of the firefighter's volunteer duties; and
23	(2) the waste was generated from a property for which
24	the site is designated.

# No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Health and Safety Code to allow a volunteer firefighter, acting within the scope of their duties, to fulfill the requirement for providing supervision of the burning of waste consisting of trees, brush, grass, leaves, branch trimmings, or other plant growth at a site that is designated for consolidating burning of waste generated from specific residential properties; located in a county with a population of less than 50,000; and located outside of a municipality.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) estimates that implementing the provisions of this bill can be accomplished using existing resources.
