1 AN ACT
2 relating to excluding a person on the suspense list from jury duty.


3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 62.001(d), Government Code, is amended
5 to read as follows:


6 (d) The list required by Subsection (a)(1) must [~~(c) may~~]
7 exclude[~~, at the option of the voter registrar of each county,~~] the
8 names of persons on the suspense list maintained under Section
9 15.081, Election Code.

10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.


