4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1001.059 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1001.059. DEPARTMENT DRIVER EDUCATION COURSE FOR DEAF
8	OR HARD OF HEARING STUDENTS. (a) The department shall:
9	(1) create a driver education course for minors and
10	adults that presents the course curriculum in American Sign
11	Language; and
12	(2) make the course described by Subdivision (1)
13	available on the department's Internet website.
14	(b) The department may collaborate with another state
15	agency or contract with a licensed driver education school or
16	instructor to create the course.
17	(c) The commission by rule shall establish a fee for the
18	course. The fee established under this section:
19	(1) is in addition to a fee charged for a certificate
20	for the course; and
21	(2) must be in an amount that is:
22	(A) not more than an amount necessary to cover
23	the cost of creating and administering the course; and
24	(B) not more than the average cost of an online

- 6 STUDENTS. (a) In this section:
- 7 (1) "Deaf" means a hearing loss of such severity that
- 8 an individual must depend on visual methods to communicate.
- 9 (2) "Hard of hearing" means a loss of hearing function
- 10 to an individual such that the individual:
- 11 (A) relies on residual hearing; and
- 12 (B) may depend on visual methods to communicate.
- (b) The commission by rule shall require a driver education
- 14 school providing a driver education course to:
- 15 <u>(1) in the manner described by the Americans with</u>
- 16 Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Section 12101 et seq.), make
- 17 reasonable modifications and provide aids and services when
- 18 providing the classroom portion of the course that are necessary to
- 19 ensure that a student who is deaf or hard of hearing may fully
- 20 participate in the course; and
- 21 (2) provide to the department the school's plan for
- 22 complying with the rules adopted under this section as a condition
- 23 of obtaining a license under Section 1001.211 or renewing a license
- 24 <u>under Section 1001.303.</u>
- (c) The rules adopted under Subsection (b) must allow a
- 26 driver education school to comply with the requirements of this
- 27 section by playing a video that presents the classroom portion of

- the driver education course in a manner that complies with the
- requirements of this section.
