14	(a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (c), a parent of a
15	deceased child is entitled to view the child's body before a justice
16	of the peace or the medical examiner, as applicable, for the county
17	in which the death occurred assumes control over the body under
18	Subchapter A or B, as applicable. If the child's death occurred at
19	a hospital or other health care facility, the viewing may be
20	conducted at the hospital or facility.
21	(b) A parent of a deceased child may not view the child's
22	body after a justice of the peace or medical examiner described by
23	Subsection (a) assumes control over the body under Subchapter A or
24	B, as applicable, unless the parent first obtains the consent of the

- (2) a parent of the deceased child may not have contact
- 17 with the child's body unless the parent first obtains the consent of

- 20 (3) a person may not remove a medical device from the
- 21 child's body or otherwise alter the condition of the body for
