4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 51.713 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.713. ADDITIONAL FILING FEE FOR CIVIL CASES IN
8	WILLACY COUNTY AND STARR COUNTY. (a) This section applies only to:
9	(1) district courts, the constitutional county court,
10	and justice courts in Willacy County; and
11	(2) district courts, the county court at law, and
12	justice courts in Starr County.
13	(b) Except as otherwise provided by this section and in
14	addition to all other fees authorized or required by other law, the
15	clerk of a court shall collect a filing fee of not more than \$20 in
16	each civil case filed in the court, if the fee is authorized by the
17	commissioners court of the county collecting the fee. A fee
18	collected under this section is to be used:
19	(1) for the construction, renovation, or improvement
20	of the facilities that house the Willacy County or Starr County
21	civil courts; and
22	(2) to pay the principal of, interest on, and costs of
23	issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation, or
24	improvement of the facilities that house the Willacy County or

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1	Starr County civil courts.
2	(c) Court fees due under this section shall be collected in
3	the same manner as other fees, fines, or costs are collected in the
4	case.

5 (d) The clerk shall send the fees collected under this 6 section to the county treasurer of the county in which the court is located or to any other official who discharges the duties commonly 7 assigned to the county treasurer at least as frequently as monthly. 8 9 The treasurer or other official shall deposit the fees in a special account in the county treasury dedicated to: 10 11 (1) the construction, renovation, or improvement of 12 the facilities that house the Willacy County or Starr County civil 13 courts; and

14 (2) pay the principal of, interest on, and costs of 15 issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation, or 16 improvement of the facilities that house the Willacy County or 17 Starr County civil courts.

18 (e) This section applies only to fees for a 12-month period 19 beginning October 1, if the commissioners court of the county 20 collecting the fee:

21 (1) adopts a resolution authorizing a fee of not more 22 than \$20;

23 (2) adopts a resolution requiring the county to spend 24 one dollar for the construction, renovation, or improvement of the 25 court facilities or to pay the principal of, interest on, and costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction of court 26 facilities for each dollar spent from the special account dedicated 27

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1 to that purpose; and 2 (3) files the resolutions with the county treasurer or 3 with any other official who discharges the duties commonly assigned to the county treasurer not later than September 1 immediately 4 5 preceding the first 12-month period during which the fees are to be 6 collected. 7 (f) A resolution adopted under Subsection (e) continues 8 from year to year until October 1, 2045, allowing the county to 9 collect fees under the terms of this section until the resolution is 10 rescinded. 11 (g) The commissioners court of the county collecting the fee 12 may rescind a resolution adopted under Subsection (e) by adopting a 13 resolution rescinding the resolution and submitting the rescission 14 resolution to the county treasurer or to any other official who discharges the duties commonly assigned to the county treasurer not 15 later than September 1 preceding the beginning of the first day of 16 the county fiscal year. The commissioners court may adopt an 17 additional resolution in the manner provided by Subsection (e) 18 19 after rescinding a previous resolution under that subsection. 20 (h) A fee established under a particular resolution is 21 abolished on the earlier of: 22 (1) the date a resolution adopted under Subsection (e) 23 is rescinded as provided by Subsection (g); or 24 (2) October 1, 2045. 25 (i) Willacy County or Starr County may make the required 26 expenditure described by Subsection (e)(2) at any time, regardless 27 of when the expenditure from the special account occurs.

Subchapter E, Chapter 101, Government Code, is 15 amended by adding Section 101.081195 to read as follows: 16 Sec. 101.081195. ADDITIONAL STATUTORY COUNTY COURT FEES FOR COURT FACILITIES: GOVERNMENT CODE. The clerk of a statutory county 17 court in Starr County shall collect an additional filing fee of not 18 19 more than \$20 under Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases 20 to fund the: 21 (1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court 22 facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and 23 (2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and 24 costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation, 25 or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county 26 commissioners court. 27 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 101, Government Code, is

18	shall collect an additional filing fee of not more than \$20 under
19	Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases to fund the:
20	(1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court
21	facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and
22	(2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and
23	costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation,
24	or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county
25	commissioners court.
26	SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.



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

# **Texas Historical Commission names Astrodome a landmark**

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) The exas Historical Commission has anted landmark status to the ouston Astrodome amid plans redevelop the vacant stadium.

Commission members voted iday to recognize the Astroome as a Texas antiquities landark and to provide legal protecons.

The Astrodome opened in 165 and has been vacant for 18 ars, falling into disrepair. The closed stadium was declared tift for occupancy in 2009. Vots in 2013 rejected a \$217 miln renovation package.

Harris County commissions last year approved a \$105 miln redevelopment project that cludes space for public and her commercial use, plus park-

ing.

County Judge Ed Emmett expressed appreciation Friday for the landmark designation. He said officials will work closely with the Texas Historical Commission on future Astrodome plans.

The Astrodome in 2014 joined the National Register of Historic Places.
