H.B. No. 2875

AN ACT

relating to the imposition of additional fees for filing civil cases in Willacy County and Starr County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 51.713 to read as follows:

Sec. 51.713. ADDITIONAL FILING FEE FOR CIVIL CASES IN WILLACY COUNTY AND STARR COUNTY. (a) This section applies only to:

(1) district courts, the constitutional county court, and justice courts in Willacy County; and

(2) district courts, the county court at law, and justice courts in Starr County.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this section and in addition to all other fees authorized or required by other law, the clerk of a court shall collect a filing fee of not more than \$20 in each civil case filed in the court, if the fee is authorized by the commissioners court of the county collecting the fee. A fee collected under this section is to be used:

(1) for the construction, renovation, or improvement of the facilities that house the Willacy County or Starr County civil courts; and

(2) to pay the principal of, interest on, and costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation, or improvement of the facilities that house the Willacy County or

1 Starr County civil courts.

2 (c) Court fees due under this section shall be collected in
3 the same manner as other fees, fines, or costs are collected in the
4 case.

5 (d) The clerk shall send the fees collected under this
6 section to the county treasurer of the county in which the court is
7 located or to any other official who discharges the duties commonly
8 assigned to the county treasurer at least as frequently as monthly.
9 The treasurer or other official shall deposit the fees in a special
10 account in the county treasury dedicated to:

11 (1) the construction, renovation, or improvement of
12 the facilities that house the Willacy County or Starr County civil
13 courts; and

14 (2) pay the principal of, interest on, and costs of
15 issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation, or
16 improvement of the facilities that house the Willacy County or
17 Starr County civil courts.

18 (e) This section applies only to fees for a 12-month period
19 beginning October 1, if the commissioners court of the county
20 collecting the fee:

21 (1) adopts a resolution authorizing a fee of not more
22 than \$20;

23 (2) adopts a resolution requiring the county to spend
24 one dollar for the construction, renovation, or improvement of the
25 court facilities or to pay the principal of, interest on, and costs
26 of issuance of bonds issued for the construction of court
27 facilities for each dollar spent from the special account dedicated

1 to that purpose; and

2 (3) files the resolutions with the county treasurer or
3 with any other official who discharges the duties commonly assigned
4 to the county treasurer not later than September 1 immediately
5 preceding the first 12-month period during which the fees are to be
6 collected.

7 (f) A resolution adopted under Subsection (e) continues
8 from year to year until October 1, 2045, allowing the county to
9 collect fees under the terms of this section until the resolution is
10 rescinded.

11 (g) The commissioners court of the county collecting the fee
12 may rescind a resolution adopted under Subsection (e) by adopting a
13 resolution rescinding the resolution and submitting the rescission
14 resolution to the county treasurer or to any other official who
15 discharges the duties commonly assigned to the county treasurer not
16 later than September 1 preceding the beginning of the first day of
17 the county fiscal year. The commissioners court may adopt an
18 additional resolution in the manner provided by Subsection (e)
19 after rescinding a previous resolution under that subsection.

20 (h) A fee established under a particular resolution is
21 abolished on the earlier of:

22 (1) the date a resolution adopted under Subsection (e)
23 is rescinded as provided by Subsection (g); or

24 (2) October 1, 2045.

25 (i) Willacy County or Starr County may make the required
26 expenditure described by Subsection (e)(2) at any time, regardless
27 of when the expenditure from the special account occurs.

1 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 101, Government Code, is
2 amended by adding Section 101.061194 to read as follows:

3 Sec. 101.061194. ADDITIONAL DISTRICT COURT FEES FOR COURT
4 FACILITIES: GOVERNMENT CODE. The clerk of a district court in
5 Willacy County and the clerk of a district court in Starr County
6 shall collect an additional filing fee of not more than \$20 under
7 Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases to fund the:

8 (1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court
9 facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and

10 (2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and
11 costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation,
12 or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county
13 commissioners court.

14 SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 101, Government Code, is
15 amended by adding Section 101.081195 to read as follows:

16 Sec. 101.081195. ADDITIONAL STATUTORY COUNTY COURT FEES FOR
17 COURT FACILITIES: GOVERNMENT CODE. The clerk of a statutory county
18 court in Starr County shall collect an additional filing fee of not
19 more than \$20 under Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases
20 to fund the:

21 (1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court
22 facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and

23 (2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and
24 costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation,
25 or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county
26 commissioners court.

27 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 101, Government Code, is

1 amended by adding Section 101.12122 to read as follows:

2 Sec. 101.12122. ADDITIONAL COUNTY COURT FEES FOR COURT
3 FACILITIES: GOVERNMENT CODE. The clerk of the county court in
4 Willacy County shall collect an additional filing fee of not more
5 than \$20 under Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases to
6 fund the:

7 (1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court
8 facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and

9 (2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and
10 costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation,
11 or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county
12 commissioners court.


13 SECTION 5. Subchapter H, Chapter 101, Government Code, is
14 amended by adding Section 101.143 to read as follows:

15 Sec. 101.143. ADDITIONAL JUSTICE COURT FEES FOR COURT
16 FACILITIES COLLECTED BY CLERK. The clerk of a justice court in
17 Willacy County and the clerk of a justice court in Starr County
18 shall collect an additional filing fee of not more than \$20 under
19 Section 51.713, Government Code, in civil cases to fund the:


20 (1) construction, renovation, or improvement of court
21 facilities, if authorized by the county commissioners court; and

22 (2) payment of the principal of, interest on, and
23 costs of issuance of bonds issued for the construction, renovation,
24 or improvement of court facilities, if authorized by the county
25 commissioners court.

26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.



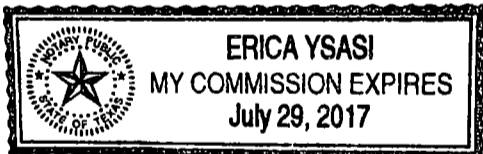

Texas Historical Commission names Astrodome a landmark

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) The Texas Historical Commission has granted landmark status to the Houston Astrodome amid plans to redevelop the vacant stadium.

Commission members voted Friday to recognize the Astrodome as a Texas antiquities landmark and to provide legal protections.

The Astrodome opened in 1965 and has been vacant for 18 years, falling into disrepair. The closed stadium was declared unfit for occupancy in 2009. Voters in 2013 rejected a \$217 million renovation package.

Harris County commissioners last year approved a \$105 million redevelopment project that includes space for public and other commercial use, plus park-

ing. County Judge Ed Emmett expressed appreciation Friday for the landmark designation. He said officials will work closely with the

Texas Historical Commission on future Astrodome plans.

The Astrodome in 2014 joined the National Register of Historic Places.

responders have rescued two window washers after one side of their scaffold gave way about 100 stories up along a Dallas skyscraper.

Both men were saved Wednesday afternoon from the side of the Prosperity Bank building in North Dallas. The scaffold still dangling from the 15-story building as the hour-long rescue ended during cloudy conditions with wind gusts topping 15 mph.

Authorities are trying to determine what caused the scaffold to give way.

Dallas Fire-Rescue teams were able to reach one of the stranded workers and pull him from the roof. Live TV coverage showed an emergency responder reaching the other man, who was lowered to the ground with the help of a harness.

Medical personnel were examining both men. Their names and further details about the incident weren't immediately released.

Border Patrol chief out day after Trump border fence decree

WASHINGTON (AP) - The chief of the Border Patrol has resigned from the agency that's in charge of securing America's borders with Mexico and Canada.

According to a U.S. official and a former official, Border Patrol agents have been told that Mark Morgan is no longer on the job. It's not immediately clear whether Morgan resigned or was asked to leave.

The U.S. official wasn't authorized to discuss the move before a public announcement. The former official asked not to be identified before a government announcement.

Morgan's departure comes a day after President Donald Trump announced plans to build a wall at the Mexican border and to hire 5,000 Border Patrol agents.
