15	installers for work performed in the municipality or region.
16	(f) A municipality or region may not collect a permit fee,
17	registration fee, administrative fee, or any other fee from an
18	electrician who holds a license issued under this chapter for work
19	performed in the municipality or region. This subsection does not
20	prohibit a municipality or region from collecting a building permit
21	<u>fee.</u>
22	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.


