

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:


5 SECTION 1. Section 11.032(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (c) Not later than the 10th day of each month the department
8 may [~~shall~~] transfer an amount not to exceed 15 percent of all
9 amounts collected during the previous month from sources described
10 by Subsection (b)(15), (16), or (22) to the state parks account.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.



IN RE: HB448 by Guillen (Relating to the transfer of certain revenue into the state parks account.), **As Engrossed**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>
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The bill would amend the Parks and Wildlife Code regarding the required monthly transfer of 15 percent of boat registration and titling fee revenue from the Game, Fish, and Water Safety Account No. 9 (Fund 9) to the State Parks Account No. 64 (Fund 64). The bill would make this transfer permissive instead of mandatory and allow the percentage transferred to fluctuate up to 15 percent of the total at the discretion of the Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD).

This analysis assumes that the transfer would continue to take place at 15 percent each month. Based upon information provided by the agency, the amount anticipated to be transferred under this provision each fiscal year of the 2018-19 biennium is \$2,985,224. However, depending on action taken by TPWD related to amounts transferred, there could be a gain of up to \$2,985,224 in Fund 9 and a corresponding loss of the same amount in Fund 64.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
