18 (a-1) The list must include programs <u>and practices</u> in the 19 following areas:

- 22 <u>establishing</u> and maintaining positive relationships, and

- 7 (1) any existing suicide prevention method developed

- 9 (2) any Internet or online course or program developed
- 10 in this state or another state that is based on best practices
- 11 recognized by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
- 12 Administration or the Suicide Prevention Resource Center.
- SECTION 2. Section 21.044(c-1), Education Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (c-1) Any minimum academic qualifications for a certificate
- 16 specified under Subsection (a) that require a person to possess a
- 17 bachelor's degree must also require that the person receive, as
- 18 part of the training required to obtain that certificate,
- 19 instruction regarding mental health, substance abuse, and youth
- 20 suicide. The instruction required must:
- 21 (1) be provided through a program selected from the
- 22 list of recommended best practice-based programs and
- 23 research-based practices established under Section 161.325, Health
- 24 and Safety Code; and
- 25 (2) include effective strategies for teaching and
- 26 intervening with students with mental or emotional disorders,
- 27 including de-escalation techniques and positive behavioral

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- 1 interventions and supports.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
