- Sec. 8002.102. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district
- 24 issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the
- 25 district shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing
- 26 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all
- 27 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner

- 1 provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code.
- 2 SECTION 2. The Harris County Municipal Utility District
- 3 No. 61 retains all the rights, powers, privileges, authority,
- 4 duties, and functions that it had before the effective date of this
- 5 Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. (a) The legislature validates and confirms all
- 7 governmental acts and proceedings of the Harris County Municipal
- 8 Utility District No. 61 that were taken before the effective date of
- 9 this Act.
- 10 (b) This section does not apply to any matter that on the
- 11 effective date of this Act:
- 12 (1) is involved in litigation if the litigation
- 13 ultimately results in the matter being held invalid by a final court
- 14 judgment; or
- 15 (2) has been held invalid by a final court judgment.
- 16 SECTION 4. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 17 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 18 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 19 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 20 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 21 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 22 Government Code.
- 23 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 24 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 25 Environmental Quality.
- 26 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 27 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the

- 3 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 4 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect

- 7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

House Bill (HB) 4324, as Filed by Representative Mike Schofield - Relating to the powers and duties of the Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 61; providing authority to issue bonds and impose fees and taxes.

Dear Speaker Straus:

The following comments are provided pursuant to the Constitutional requirements referenced above. Under those requirements, the TCEQ must submit, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives, the TCEQ's recommendations on specific legislation affecting water districts. We recommend that these comments be considered in the evaluation of the proposed legislation.

This bill codifies Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 61 (District) as Chapter 8002, Special District Local Laws Code, to specify the following; the District has the powers and duties of a standard municipal utility district under Water Code Chapters 49 and 54, with the following exceptions; the bill grants the District authority for road projects; notwithstanding the acreage requirement under Section 54.801(a), Water Code, the District may establish and administer defined areas as provided by Subchapter J, Chapter 54, Water Code; the District may add or exclude land from the defined areas in the same manner the District may add or exclude land from the District; and at the time of issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of real property in the District.



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


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
