9	of this section, "post-discharge services" means community-based
10	services offered after a child is discharged from probation to
11	support the child's vocational, educational, behavioral, or other
12	goals and to provide continuity for the child as the child
13	transitions out of juvenile probation services. The term includes:
14	(1) behavioral health services;
15	(2) mental health services;
16	(3) substance abuse services;
17	(4) mentoring;
18	(5) job training; and
19	(6) educational services.
20	(b) Provided that existing resources are available, a
21	juvenile board or juvenile probation department may provide
22	post-discharge services to a child for not more than six months
23	after the date the child is discharged from probation, regardless
24	of the age of the child on that date.

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1	(c) A juvenile board or juvenile probation department may
2	not require a child to participate in post-discharge services.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Human Resources Code to define post-discharge services, specify a maximum amount of time that a child may participate, and that the juvenile board or juvenile probation department may not require a child's participation in the services. Based on the analysis of the Office of Court Administration, Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor, and the Juvenile Justice Department, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
