STUDY ON TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH AN INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY. (a) 7 The Health 8 and Human Services Commission in conjunction with the Texas 9 Workforce Commission shall conduct a study regarding occupational 10 training programs available in this state for individuals with an 11 intellectual disability. 12 (b) The study must: 13 (1)determine regions in this state where the training programs should be improved or expanded; and 14 15 determine (2) strategies for placing trained 16 individuals with intellectual disabilities into fulfilling jobs using existing or improved training programs. 17 18 (c) Not later than December 1, 2018, the Health and Human Services Commission shall report the results of the study to the 19 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of 20 representatives, and the appropriate standing committees of the 21 senate and the house of representatives. 22

23 (d) This section expires September 1, 2019.

24 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September



No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.
