FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT. The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit. 8 9 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of: 10 (1) a municipal utility district as provided by general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and 11 12 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation, 13 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 14 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. 15 Sec. 7924.006. - 17 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner
- 18 provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code.
- 19 Sec. 7924.203. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of
- 20 <u>issuance</u>, the total principal amount of bonds or other ob<u>ligations</u>
- 21 <u>issued</u> or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad
- 22 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the
- 23 <u>real property in the district.</u>

- Sec. 7924.106. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may
- 18 not exercise the power of eminent domain.
- 19 (b) This section is not intended to be an expression of a
- 20 legislative interpretation of the requirements of Section 17(c),
- 21 Article I, Texas Constitution.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

The Legislative Budget Board, in cooperation with the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), has determined that:

This bill creates Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 544 (District) with the powers and duties of a standard municipal utility district under Water Code Chapters 49 and 54.

Population - The very specific description of the proposed boundaries does not allow staff to develop precise population estimates. Based on the Original Texas Land Surveys mentioned in SB 2284, staff is unable to determine a population estimate.

Population growth in the specific area since the 2010 census is unknown. The 2010 population estimate for areas of Harris County served by small systems or private wells (County-Other) is 204,630. The Harris County-Other population projections approved for the 2017 State Water Plan projects the population to grow to 245,944 in 2020, 291,438 in 2030 and 311,968 in 2040.

Location - The Proposed district's initial boundaries are described with a combination of Original Texas Land Surveys, Harris County Real Property Records and metes and bounds. Due to the complexity of these boundaries for the various sub areas of the district, staff is able to determine only the general location of the proposed district.

The proposed district's area is approximately 0.22 square miles in northeastern Harris County, located east of the City of Humble on the eastern side of Lake Houston. The proposed district does not appear to overlap any existing Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) boundary.

Comments on Powers/Duties Different from Similar Types of Districts: The bill removes the District's eligibility to be included in a tax increment reinvestment zone under Chapter 311, Tax Code; the Senate Committee Substitute removes Section 7924.106, which allowed the City of Houston to annex all or part of the District into its corporate limits without annexing the entire District under terms of a development agreement; the Senate Committee Substitute removes the provision stating the District may not exercise the power of eminent domain outside the District without the written consent of the City of Houston.

The bill requires the TCEQ to appoint the five initial temporary directors upon receipt of a petition from the owners of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the District; this bill grants the District authority for road projects; the District may not exercise the power of eminent domain outside the District without the written consent of the City of Houston; the bill specifies that at the time of issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of real property in the District; if the bill does not receive a two-thirds vote of all members elected to each house, the District may not exercise the power of eminent domain.

Overlapping Services: TCEQ does not have mapping information for water and/or wastewater providers because this function was transferred from the TCEQ to the Public Utility Commission on September 1, 2014. As a result, TCEQ is unaware of possible overlapping service providers.

TCEQ's Supervision: As with general law districts, the TCEQ will have general supervisory authority, including bond review authority and review of financial reports.

Water Use - SB 2284 specifies that "the district has the powers and duties provided by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution".

Within Harris County, 26 percent of the total water use was groundwater (Gulf Coast and other Aquifers) in 2014. Eighty two percent of all the groundwater pumping was for municipal use. The water source of the proposed district might pursue is unknown.
