- 5 SECTION 1. Section 411.121(c), Government Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to a request by the adjutant general to obtain criminal history
- 9 record information on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 10 request for criminal history record information before the
- 11 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 12 date the information was requested, and the former law is continued
- 13 in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would repeal Section 411.121(c) of the Government Code, which consequently would entitle the Adjutant General to the criminal history record information on an applicant for enlistment in the Texas military forces, or an applicant for employment with the Texas Military Department, without being required to submit a signed statement to the Department of Public Safety to obtain the information. It is assumed any costs resulting from the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2017.

Local Government Impact
