S.B. No. 1024

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the use of certain lighting equipment on airport
3 security vehicles.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 22, Transportation Code,
6 is amended by adding Section 22.091 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 22.091. AIRPORT SECURITY VEHICLES. (a) In this
8 section, "airport security vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:


9 (1) is owned or leased by a joint board; and


10 (2) has been designated or authorized by the joint
11 board.

12 (b) An airport security vehicle may be equipped with
13 flashing blue and amber lights visible from directly in front of the
14 center of the vehicle.

15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.


