4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 442.019 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 442.019. TOM LEA TRAIL. (a) The commission shall
8	develop a Tom Lea Trail program to commemorate the life and art of
9	Tom Lea.
10	(b) The program, at a minimum, shall include:
11	(1) designation of locations that are historically
12	significant to the life and art of Tom Lea;
13	(2) adoption of an icon, symbol, or other identifying
14	device to represent a designation under this section;
15	(3) the use of the icon, symbol, or other identifying
16	device in promoting tourism around this state by the commission and
17	at locations designated under this section; and
18	(4) the development of itineraries and maps to guide
19	tourists to locations designated under this section.
20	(c) The commission shall adopt:
21	(1) eligibility criteria for a designation under this
22	section; and
23	(2) procedures to administer the program created under
24	this section.

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1 (d) A historic marker or sign relating to the life and art of 2 Tom Lea that is erected or maintained pursuant to the program 3 adopted under this section must be located not more than five miles from a location designated under Subsection (b)(1). 4 5 (e) The commission may, as necessary, enter into a 6 memorandum of understanding with the Texas Economic Development and 7 Tourism Office and the Texas Department of Transportation to 8 implement this section. 9 (f) The commission may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and 10 other donations from any source to implement this section. The 11 commission is not required to promote or market the Tom Lea Trail 12 unless the commission receives funds raised from private entities 13 for that purpose. 14 (g) The following segments of highway shall constitute the Tom Lea Trail: 15 16 (1) Interstate Highway 10 from its intersection with 17 the northern municipal boundary of El Paso to its intersection with 18 Interstate Highway 20; 19 (2) Interstate Highway 20 from its intersection with Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with the western 20 21 municipal boundary of Sweetwater; 22 (3) Interstate Highway 20 from its intersection with 23 the eastern municipal boundary of Sweetwater to its intersection 24 with U.S. Highway 277; 25 (4) U.S. Highway 277 from its intersection with 26 Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with State Highway 114 in 27 Seymour;

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1	(5) State Highway 114 from its intersection with U.S.
2	Highway 277 in Seymour to its intersection with State Highway 199;
3	(6) State Highway 199 from its intersection with U.S.
4	Highway 281 to its intersection with Interstate Highway 30;
5	(7) Interstate Highway 30 from its intersection with
6	State Highway 199 to its intersection with Interstate Highway 35
7	East in Dallas;
8	(8) Interstate Highway 35 East from its intersection
9	with Interstate Highway 30 in Dallas to its intersection with State
10	<u>Highway 6 outside of the southern municipal boundary of Waco;</u>
11	(9) State Highway 6 from its intersection with
12	Interstate 35 East to its intersection with State Highway 30 in
13	College Station;
14	(10) State Highway 30 from its intersection with State
15	<u>Highway 6 in College Station to its intersection with Interstate</u>
16	Highway 45;
17	(11) Interstate Highway 45 from its intersection with
18	<u>State Highway 30 to its terminus in Galveston;</u>
19	(12) State Highway 21 from its intersection with State
20	Highway 6 to its intersection with U.S. Highway 290;
21	(13) U.S. Highway 290 from its intersection with
22	State Highway 21 to its intersection with the eastern municipal
23	boundary of Austin;
24	(14) U.S. Highway 290 from its intersection with the
25	western municipal boundary of Austin to its intersection with the
26	eastern municipal boundary of Fredericksburg;
27	(15) U.S. Highway 290 from its intersection with the

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western municipal boundary of Fredericksburg to its intersection 1 2 with Interstate Highway 10; 3 (16) Interstate Highway 10 from its intersection with 4 U.S. Highway 290: 5 (A) west to its intersection with U.S. Highway 6 385; and 7 (B) east to its intersection with Interstate 8 Highway 37; 9 (17) U.S. Highway 385 from its intersection with Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with the southern 10 11 municipal boundary of Odessa; 12 (18) Interstate Highway 37 from its intersection with 13 Interstate Highway 10 to its intersection with U.S. Highway 77; 14(19) U.S. Highway 77 from its intersection with 15 Interstate Highway 37 to its intersection with the northern 16 municipal boundary of Kingsville; 17 (20) U.S. Highway 77 from its intersection with the 18 southern municipal boundary of Kingsville to its intersection with 19 State Highway 285 in Riviera; and 20 (21) State Highway 285 from its intersection with U.S. 21 Highway 77 in Riviera to its intersection with the eastern 22 municipal boundary of Hebbronville. 23 (h) In this section, a reference to a municipal boundary 24 means that boundary as it exists on September 1, 2017. 25 (i) A designation of highway segments as the Tom Lea Trail 26 may not be construed as a designation under the National Historic Preservation Act (54 U.S.C. Section 300101 et seq.). 27

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1 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 225, Transportation Code, 2 is amended by adding Sections 225.123 and 225.124 to read as 3 follows: 4 Sec. 225.123. CHARLES H. ROAN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY. (a) The 5 portion of U.S. Highway 287 in Claude is designated as the Charles 6 H. Roan Memorial Highway. 7 (b) Subject to Section 225.021(c), the department shall: 8 (1) design and construct markers indicating the 9 designation as the Charles H. Roan Memorial Highway and any other 10 appropriate information; and 11 (2) erect a marker at each end of the highway and at 12 appropriate intermediate sites along the highway. 13 Sec. 225.124. KOLLYN BARTON MEMORIAL HIGHWAY. (a) The 14 portion of Farm-to-Market Road 666 in Nueces County between its 15 intersection with State Highway 44 and Farm-to-Market Road 624 is 16 designated as the Kollyn Barton Memorial Highway. 17 (b) Subject to Section 225.021(c), the department shall: 18 (1) design and construct markers indicating the 19 designation as the Kollyn Barton Memorial Highway and any other 20 appropriate information; and 21 (2) erect a marker at each end of the highway and at 22 appropriate intermediate sites along the highway. 23 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 225, Transportation Code, 24 is amended by adding Section 225.123 to read as follows: 25 Sec. 225.123. NAVARRO COUNTY VIETNAM MEMORIAL LOOP. (a) 26 The portion of State Highway 31 under construction as of September 27 1, 2017, as a relief route around Corsicana, in Navarro County is

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1	designated as the Navarro County Vietnam Memorial Loop.
2	(b) Subject to Section 225.021(c), the department shall:
3	(1) design and construct markers indicating the
4	designation as the Navarro County Vietnam Memorial Loop and any
5	other appropriate information; and
6	(2) erect a marker at each end of the highway and at
7	appropriate intermediate sites along the highway.
8	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.



IN RE: HB1317 by King, Ken (Relating to the designation of U.S. Highway 287 in Claude as the Charles H. Roan Memorial Highway.), As Passed 2nd House

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to design, construct, and erect highway markers to assign memorial designations on certain road segments on the state highway system, subject to Transportation Code §225.021(c).

The bill would amend the Government Code to require the Texas Historical Commission (THC) to develop a Tom Lea Trail Program to commemorate the life and art of Tom Lea. At a minimum, the program would include a designation of locations that are historically significant to the life and art of Tom Lea, adoption and use of an icon, symbol, or other identifying device to show a designation under the program, and the development of itineraries and maps to guide tourists to locations designated under the program. The bill would allow THC to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office and TxDOT to implement the program. The bill would specify that THC may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and other donations from any source to implement the program and that THC is not required to promote or market the Tom Lea Trail unless it receives funds from private entities for that purpose.

The bill would take effect on September 1, 2017.

Section 225.021 (c), Transportation Code, specifies that TxDOT may not design, construct, or erect the marker unless a grant or donation of funds is made to the department to cover the cost. Based on the analysis of TxDOT, it is assumed any duties associated with the implementation of the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within the agency's existing resources.

THC, TxDOT, and the Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor assume any costs associated with implementing the bill's provisions regarding the Tom Lea Trail Progam could be absorbed within current resources.
