4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:


5 SECTION 1. Section 443.030, Government Code, is amended to
6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 443.030. SUPPORT ORGANIZATIONS. (a) The board may
8 establish, maintain, and participate in the operation of one or
9 more organizations of persons whose purpose is to raise funds for or
10 provide services or other benefits to the board. The [~~Such an~~]
11 organization may be incorporated as a Texas nonprofit corporation.


12 (b) The board shall contract with a nonprofit corporation
13 formed to assist in the preservation, maintenance, and improvement
14 of the Capitol and the Capitol grounds to develop and implement a
15 plan for the solicitation and acceptance of gifts, grants, devises,
16 and bequests of money, other property, and services to be used to
17 preserve, maintain, and improve the Capitol and the Capitol
18 grounds. The board may contract with a nonprofit corporation
19 described by Subsection (a) or another nonprofit corporation.

20 SECTION 2. The State Preservation Board shall enter into
21 the contract required by Section 443.030, Government Code, as
22 amended by this Act, not later than September 1, 2018.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.







IN RE: HB1829 by Geren (Relating to the preservation, maintenance, and improvement of the Capitol and the Capitol grounds.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 443, Government Code, to require that the State Preservation Board (board) enter into a contract with a nonprofit corporation formed to assist in the preservation, maintenance, and improvement of the Capitol and the Capitol grounds to develop and implement a plan for the solicitation and acceptance of gifts, grants, devises, and bequest of money, other property, and services to be used to preserve, maintain, and improve the Capitol and Capitol grounds. The board would be required to enter into the contract not later than September 1, 2018. According to the board, the provisions of the bill could be implemented within existing resources.
