- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.9772(b), Education Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:
- 7 In each year, the governor and the lieutenant governor 8 may each appoint two students and two alternates and each state 9 senator and each state representative may appoint one student and one alternate to receive an initial scholarship under this 10 subchapter. If a student appointed under this subsection to 11 receive a scholarship fails to initially meet eligibility or 12 otherwise meet the requirements to initially receive the 13 scholarship, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board must 14
- 15 <u>notify the alternate on file of their nomination.</u>
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
