12	(d) Except as provided by this subsection, a [A] person who
13	has received a written jury summons [and a written jury summons
14	questionnaire] shall complete and submit <u>a jury summons</u> [the]
15	questionnaire when the person reports for jury duty. If the
16	district and criminal district judges of a county adopt a plan for
17	an electronic jury selection method under Section 62.011, the
18	county may allow a person to complete and submit a jury summons
19	questionnaire on the court's Internet website as authorized under
20	Section 62.0111(b)(5).
21	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
22	62.0132, Government Code, applies only to a written jury summons
23	sent on or after the effective date of this Act. A written jury
24	summons sent before the effective date of this Act is governed by

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1 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
2 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
