Seven thousand miles of Southwestern natural beauty and culture present an eagle-eye's view atop Ranger Peak in El Paso's Franklin Mountains. A four-minute climb treats visitors to a 946-foot vertical rise while guides show various points including a view that spans three states and two nations. Upon reaching Wyler Observatory at 5,632 feet, sky-travelers spot the Hueco Mountains, New Mexico's white sands and the Samalayuca dunes in Mexico. Nightfall holds enchantment. Following the flaming brilliance of a West Texas sunset, shimmering lights in El Paso and Juarez, Mexico, make for a dazzling decent on the return journey.

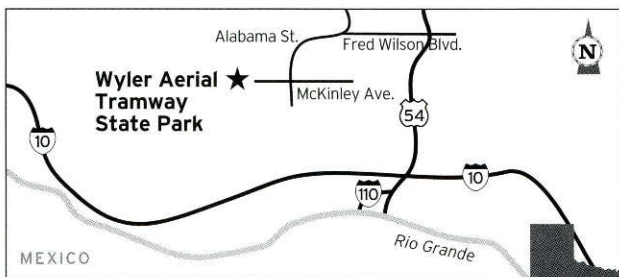
