

TEXAS OFFICIAL TRAVEL MAP

The Texas Official Travel Map is published annually by the Texas Department of Transportation in the interest of the traveling public. Special efforts have been made in compiling data to show maximum information in the most legible manner. This map is intended to assist travelers in safely exploring the wide diversity of interesting places and landscapes that Texas has to offer.

mileage figures are computed along the shortest routes between red triangles. Limited space necessitates omission of certain data, including some smaller communities; however, villages located at highway junctions are listed, along with all county seats and their elevations. While many miles of state farm and ranch roads are not included, all such roads are shown that connect arterial highways, or lead to communities and recreational areas. The major streams and public lakes of Texas are indicated.

On the back side of the map, city area insets are not intended to be detailed city maps, but to aid cross-country motorists traveling through those metropolitan areas. The area insets also show satellite cities and towns that are within and around such metropolitan areas. Often such satellite communities cannot be fully identified on the main map because of space limitations. The legend in the lower right corner of this side of the map identifies the various symbols and design characteristics on which this map is based. The grid just below this message provides a convenient means of estimating distances between certain Texas cities.

INFORMATION YOU SHOULD KNOW

Motor vehicle operators must maintain current liability insurance and be able to show proof if requested by law enforcement officials, regardless of age or seating position, must be required to wear a seat belt. Children up to eight years old, unless taller than 4 feet 9 inches, must be required in child safety seats.

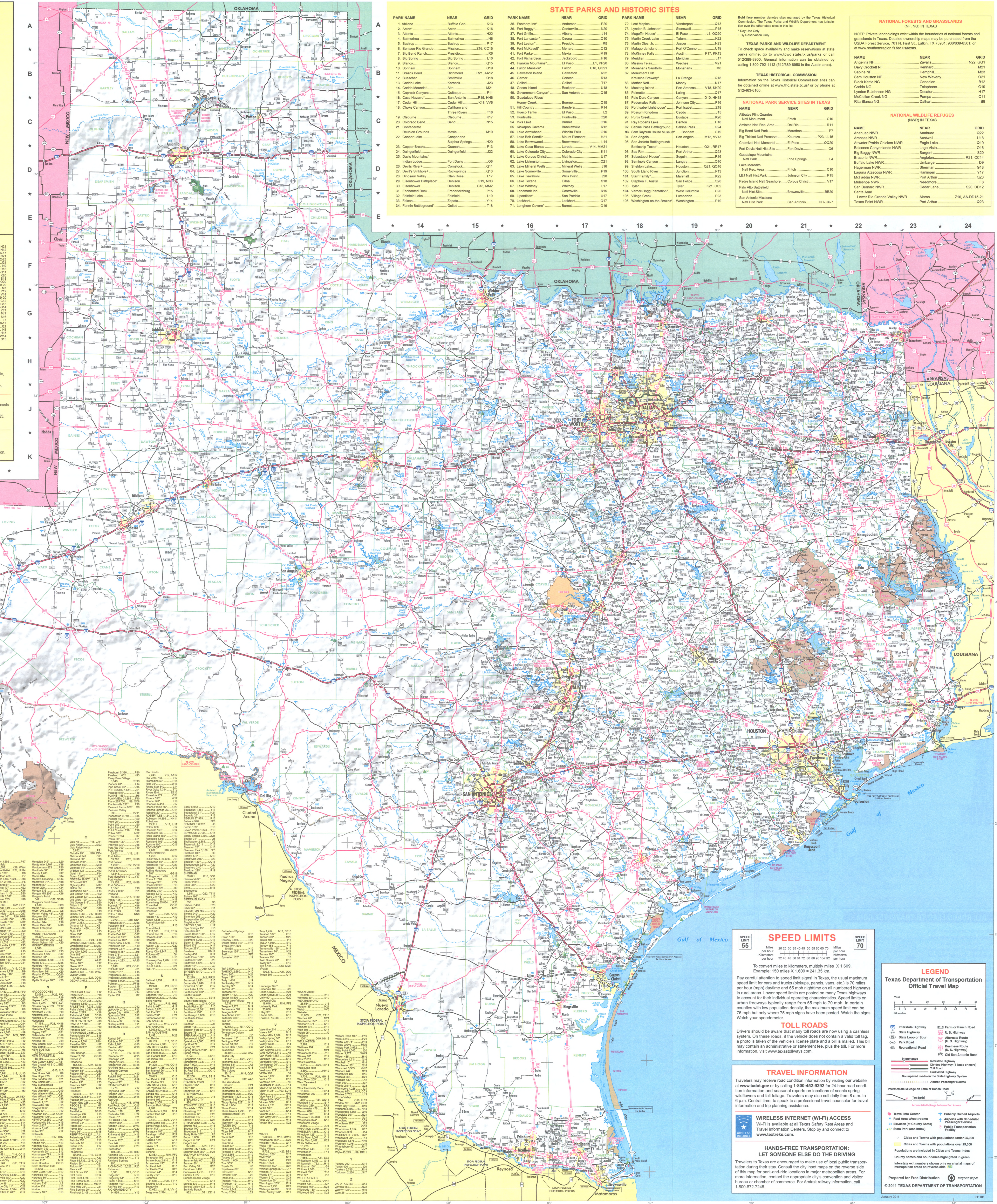
It is illegal, with certain exceptions such as an operator or emergency, to operate an open bed pickup truck or an open bed trailer or an open bed trailer when children under the age of 18 are occupying the bed of the truck or trailer, regardless of the vehicle's speed.

Motorcyclists and passengers must wear protective headgear that meets adopted standards. Exceptions are available for persons over age 21 with certain health insurance and training requirements.

Pay careful attention to speed limit signs! In Texas, the usual maximum speed limit for cars and trucks (pickup, panel, van, etc.) is 70 miles per hour (mph) daytime and 65 mph nighttime on all numbered highways in urban areas. Lower speed limits are posted on many Texas highways to account for their individual operating characteristics.

Drivers should be aware that many toll roads are now using a cashless system. On these roads, if the vehicle does not contain a valid toll tag, a photo is taken of the vehicle's license plate and a bill is mailed. This bill may contain an administrative or statement fee, plus the toll. For more information, visit www.texasstays.com.

Travelers may receive road condition information by visiting our website at www.txdot.gov or by calling 1-800-452-9292 for 24-hour road condition information and seasonal reports on locations of scenic driving, wildflowers and fall foliage. Travelers may also call daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Central time, to speak to a professional travel counselor for travel information and trip planning assistance.

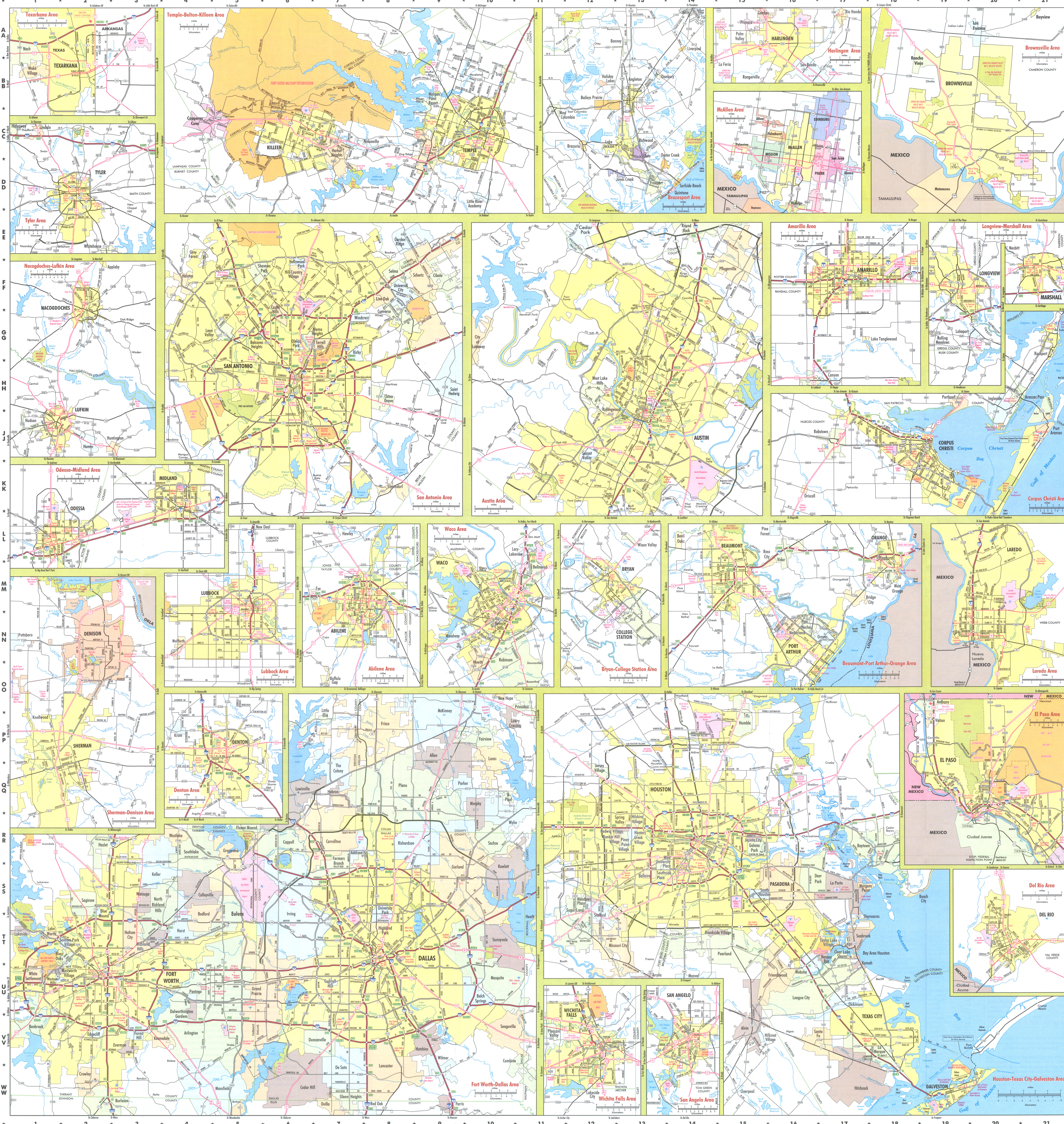
