This Bulletin has been prepared for the information of nurserymen, florists, and all other people interested in the development of the many phases of horticulture.

The Texas and out-of-state nurserymen, florists and dealers herein contained indicate those whose premises have been inspected by the Entomologist or Chief Inspector from the State in which such stock originated and who obtained a license from the Texas Department of Agriculture to do business in the State of Texas in accordance with the Texas Orchard and Nursery Inspection Law.

This list is complete up to August 31, 1926, on which date the inspection certificates terminate.

There has been a slight decrease in the number of nurseries and greenhouses in the year of 1926. This decrease was largely due to the severe drouth which occurred in Texas during the spring and summer of 1925.

In the year of 1925, certificates were issued to 1,121 nurserymen and florists, 177 dealers in nursery stock, and 297 out-of-state nurserymen and florists. In 1926, certificates were issued to 1,091 nurserymen and florists, 222 dealers, and 286 out-of-state nurserymen and florists.

The information obtained from this Bulletin will prove a good guide for those desiring to purchase nursery stock, and also to those desiring to ship nursery stock to other states.

Texas nurserymen and others desiring to ship to another state should first learn the requirements of that state and comply with its regulations; this will prevent much delay in transit and also in delivery of shipments.

Duplicate certificates will be issued by this department to all certified nurserymen and florists for filing with officials in charge of inspection of states requiring such duplicates.

TEXAS ORCHARD AND NURSERY INSPECTION LAW.

Section 1. That Article 4459, Chapter 6, Title 65, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas of 1911 be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

Art. 4459. That no person in this State shall knowingly or wilfully keep any peach, almond, apricot, nectarine or other tree affected with the contagious disease known as yellows. Nor shall any person keep for sale any apple, peach, plum or other trees affected with nematode galls, crown galls, fire blight, or root rot. Nor shall any person knowingly or wilfully keep any plum, cherry or other trees affected with the contagious disease or fungus known as black knot or plum canker; nor any tree, shrub or plant infected with or by the San Jose scale or other insect pest dangerously injurious to or destructive of trees, shrubs or other plants; nor any grapefruit, orange or lemon trees, citrus stocks, cape jasmines or other trees, plants or shrubs infected with white fly, Florida red scale,

cottony cushion scale, woolly aphis, or other injurious insect pests or citrus canker or other contagious diseases of citrus fruits, or subtropical plants, shrubs, evergreens or ornamentals, nor any china, forest or other trees, shrubs, or plants, infested with injurious insect pests or contagious diseases. Every such tree, shrub or plant shall be a public nuisance, and as such it shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Agriculture or his representatives to abate it and no damage shall be awarded for entering upon the premises upon which there are trees, shrubs or plants infected with yellows, black knot, citrus canker, plum canker, fire blight, crown gall or other infectious or dangerous disease, or infested with San Jose scale, Florida red scale, cottony cushion scale, woolly aphis, or other dangerous insect pest, for the purpose of legally inspecting the same; nor shall any damages be awarded for the treatment by the Commissioner of Agriculture or his duly authorized agents or representatives of such trees, shrubs or plants, or for altogether destroying such trees if necessary to suppress such insect pest or disease, if done in accordance with the provisions of this article. But the owner of the trees, shrubs or plants shall be notified immediately upon its being determined that such trees, shrubs, or plants should be destroyed, by a notice in writing signed by the Commissioner or the person or persons representing him, which said notice in writing shall be delivered in person to the owner of such trees, shrubs, or plants, or left at the usual place of residence of such owner, or if such owner be not a resident of the locality, to notify by leaving such notice with the person in charge of the premises, trees, shrubs or plants, or in whose possession they may be. Such notice shall contain a brief statement of the facts found to exist, whereby it is necessary to destroy such trees, shrubs or plants, and shall call attention to the law under which it is proposed to destroy them, and the owner shall within ten days from the date upon which such notice shall have been received, remove and burn all such diseased and infected trees, shrubs or plants. If, however, in the judgment of said Commissioner, or person representing him, any tree, shrub or plant infected with any disease, or infested with dangerously injurious insects, can be treated with sufficient remedies, he may direct such treatment to be carried out by the owner under the direction of the Commissioner, agent, employe or representatives. In case of objections to the findings of the chief inspector, employes or representatives of the Commissioner, an appeal may be made to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final. An appeal must be taken within five days from service of said notice, and shall act as a stay of proceedings until it is heard and decided. When the Commissioner, or chief inspector, or employe, or representative appointed by him, shall determine that any tree or trees, shrub or other plants must be treated or destroyed forthwith, he may employ all necessary assistance for that purpose, and such representative or representatives, agent or agents, employe or employes may enter upon any or all premises necessary for the purpose of such treatment, removal or destruction. But such Commissioner or the person representing him shall, before such treatment or destruction, first require the owner or person in charge of the trees, shrubs or plants, to treat or destroy same as the case may be; and upon the refusal or neglect upon the part of said owner or person in charge to so treat or destroy such trees, plants or shrubs, then such Commissioner, chief inspector, or person or persons representing him shall treat or destroy such trees, shrubs or plants, and all charges and expenses thereof shall be paid by such owner or person in charge of said trees, shrubs or plants, and shall constitute a legal claim against such owner or person in charge, which may be recovered in any court having jurisdiction upon the suit of such Commissioner or chief inspector, or the county attorney of the county where the premises are situated, together with all costs, including an attorney fee of ten dollars, to be taxed as other costs.

Note.—The above section is as amended by the Thirty-sixth Legislature, 1921.

Sec. 2. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall cause an examination to be made at least once each year of each and every nursery or other place where trees, shrubs or plants commonly known as nursery stock are grown or exposed for sale, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the trees, shrubs or plants therein kept or propagated for sale are infected

with contagious disease or diseases, or infested with insect pests. If, after such examination, it is found that the said trees, shrubs or other plants so examined are apparently free in all respects from any contagious or infectious disease or diseases, dangerously injurious insect pests, the said Commissioner shall issue to the owner or proprietor of the stock so examined a certificate setting forth the fact that the stock so examined was at the time of such examination apparently free from any and all such disease or diseases, insect pest or pests. No such certificate shall be negotiable or transferable, and shall be void if sold or transferred. Any such act or sale or transference shall be punishable as provided by this section.

All nursery stock consigned for shipment, or shipped by freight, express or other means of transportation shall be accompanied by a copy of said certificate attached to each car, box, bale, bundle or package. It is specifically provided that when such box, bale, bundle or package contains nursery stock to be delivered to more than one individual, partnership, or corporation, that each portion of such nursery stock to be delivered to such individual, partnership, or corporation shall also bear a copy of the certificate of inspection issued as provided in this section. Should any individual, partnership, or corporation, nursery agent, or dealer or broker, send out or deliver within the State, trees, vines, shrubs, plants, buds or cuttings commonly known as nursery stock, and which are subject to the attacks of insects and disease above provided for, unless he has in his possession a copy of said certificate, dated within a year thereof, deface or destroy such certificate, or wrongfully be in possession of such certificate, or fail to attach proper tags on each and every shipment, such tags bearing a copy of the said certificate, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than two hundred dollars.

Sec. 3. No individual, partnership or corporation outside the State shall be permitted to ship nursery stock into this State without first filing with the Commissioner of Agriculture a certified copy of his or their certificate of inspection issued by the proper authorities in the State in which the proposed shipment originates. This certificate must show that the stock to be shipped has been examined by the proper officer of inspection in that State or province and that the stock is apparently free from all dangerous insect pests or contagious diseases and that when fumigation is required by the Commissioner of Agriculture, that the stock has been properly fumigated. Immediately upon receipt of the filing with the Commissioner of Agriculture of this certificate, he shall, in addition, make further investigation as to the moral standing and integrity of the applicant as will satisfy him that the applicant is entitled to receive a certificate. A fee of five dollars shall be required from the applicant, upon receipt of which the Commissioner of Agriculture may issue a certificate permitting the applicant to ship into the State. Each box, bale or package of nursery stock from outside the State shall bear a tag on which is printed a copy of the certificate of this State, and also a copy of the certificate of the State in which it originates.

No transportation company or common carrier shall receive, transport or deliver shipment of nursery stock originating either within or without the State which do not bear shipping tags or labels showing the certificate of inspection of the State in which it originates, together with the permit from this State, if it be a shipment from without the State. Any individual, partnership or corporation from without the State, or any agent or any transportation company, common carrier or any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty nor more than two hundred dollars, together with all costs for each offense.

Provided, that no transportation company or common carrier shall be liable for damages to the consignee or consignor for refusing to receive for transportation or delivery such trees, packages, bales, bundles, or boxes when not accompanied by copies of the certificates provided for in this section. The agent of such companies or common carriers shall report any such shipment to the Commissioner of Agriculture immediately. Shipments of nursery stock into this State, or originating within the State, without tags or proper certificates as provided for in this section shall be dealt with as in Section 1 of this Act.

Sec. 4. The Commissioner shall have power to revoke any certificate which has been issued when he shall find that false representations have been made by the party or parties to whom certificates have been issued, or who have refused to comply with the law, instructions, rules and regulations given by the Commissioner of Agriculture in reference to the provisions of this Act and its enforcement. Any individual, partnership or corporation who shall be guilty of interfering with, refusing or preventing the Commissioner of Agriculture, or his representatives, in the execution of their official duties, to enter upon any premises owned, used or leased by them, and any person who shall make false representations for the purpose of obtaining a certificate from the Commissioner of Agriculture shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, together with all costs for each offense.

Sec. 5. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall enforce the provisions of this Act, and make and enforce such rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary for carrying into effect this Act, not inconsistent with same, and for the inspection of nurseries, orchards, forest trees, green-houses, and any other premises deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act; together with all products originating from same within the meaning of this Act. He shall also appoint one person who shall be designated as chief inspector, whose duty it will be to inspect or cause to be inspected under the directions of the Commissioner of Agriculture all trees, plants and shrubs of every kind whatsoever, grown, produced or offered for sale by any nursery, dealer, individual or corporation in this State, and also to inspect or cause to be inspected all orchards provided for in this Act, and may employ such other person or persons, expert or experts, as may be necessary from time to time for administering and carrying into operation and enforcing the provisions of this Act, provided that the chief inspector employed under the provisions of this Act shall not during the time of such service be interested in or connected with any nursery business whatsoever. The said Commissioner shall fix and collect reasonable fees for the inspection, as provided for in this Act, provided that not less than \$2.50 nor more than \$15.00 shall be charged for each inspection under the provisions of this Act. All fees collected under the provisions of this section shall be paid to the Department of Agriculture and credited to the fund provided for administering this Act.

Any person or persons, expert or experts, employed by the Commissioner of Agriculture for the purpose of administering the provisions, rules and regulations of this Act shall be paid a salary any such salary shall not exceed the sum of \$5.00 per diem and traveling expenses while actually engaged in performing their duties. Any such salary and expenses to be paid out of any fund made available to the Department of Agriculture for the enforcement of this Act.

Sec. 6. If the said Commissioner or any of his agents or employes give a false certificate, or a certificate without an actual examination of the nursery stock for which such certificate is given, to any owner, proprietor or lessee of any nursery, or owner of nursery stock, or to any other person, for use under the provisions of this Act, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and under conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars for each offense.

Sec. 7. To enforce the provisions of this Act and the rules and regulations of the Commissioner of Agriculture in reference thereto, suit shall be entered by the county attorney in any court having jurisdiction; the sheriff or peace officer of any such court shall perform his usual duties in enforcing the provisions of this Act. That any moneys appropriated for the Department of Agriculture for the administration of this Act shall be available for use to the amount necessary for the enforcement of this Act as indicated in this section, provided that all fines collected from prosecuting any individual, partnership or corporation, shall revert to the available school fund of the county in which the prosecution originates and is tried.

Sec. 8. The term "nursery stock" within the meaning of this Act shall include all fruit trees and vines, shade trees and forest trees, whether such shade or forest trees be especially grown for sale in a nursery or

taken from the forests and offered for sale; all scions, seedlings, roses, evergreens, shrubbery or ornamentals, also such greenhouse plants, or propagation stock; all classes of berry plants, cut flowers taken from plants, bushes, shrubs or other trees growing in this State, which may be a medium for disseminating injurious insect pests and contagious diseases.

The term "nursery" shall be construed to apply to any individual, premises on which nursery stock is grown, or exposed for sale. "Being in the nursery business," applies to any individual, partnership or corporation which may either sell or grow, or both grow and sell, nursery stock, regardless of the variety or quantity of nursery stock sold or grown.

The term "dealer" shall be construed to apply to any individual, partnership or corporation not growers of nursery stock, but who buy and sell nursery stock for the purpose of reselling and reshipping under their own name or title, independently of any control of those from whom they purchase. An "agent" of a nursery or dealer shall be construed to apply to any individual, partnership or corporation selling nursery stock either as being entirely under the control of the nursery or dealer with whom the nursery stock offered for barter and traffic originates, or some co-operative basis for handling nursery stock with the grower or dealer, as specified in this section. That any such agent shall have proper credentials from the dealer he represents or cooperates with, and, failing in that, any such agent shall be classed as a dealer, and subject to such rules and regulations as may be adopted relative to them, and shall be amenable to the same penalties for violations of any provisions of this Act, or the rules and regulations of the Commissioner; provided, that any agent of any dealer or nurseryman as specified in this section who shall knowingly deliver to any individual, partnership or corporation, any trees, shrub or plant infested or diseased as specified in the provisions of this Act, even though such tree, shrubs or plants are received in a box, bale or package bearing a certificate of inspection as provided in this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each such delivery, to each individual, partnership or corporation.

Sec. 9. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall prepare suitable rules and regulations for the traffic of cape jasmine cut flower shipments; also for the shipment of such greenhouse and floral plants as may require control, in order that the purposes for which this Act is established may be accomplished.

He shall also provide such rules and regulations concerning city, private or public parks, avenues of shade trees, shrubbery and ornamentals along the streets of cities, for city residences and city property generally, as will secure a protection and immunity from insect pests and contagious diseases intended to be provided for by this Act. It shall be the duty of city administrations, through their proper officers, the duty of owners of parks, of city residences or other city property, to obey these rules and regulations, and co-operate with the Commissioner of Agriculture or his representatives, in enforcing such rules and regulations, or any provisions of this Act.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

Note.—The above law, as amended is effective June 11, 1821.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Promulgated by the Commissioner of Agriculture under authority of Section 5 of orchard, nursery, etc., inspection law, for guidance in the administration of the provisions of this Act.

1. Each person, firm, or corporation conducting a nursery or dealing in nursery stock as defined within the meaning of Sections 1 and 2 of this Act, shall apply for an inspection of any such properties not later than June 15 of each year, and shall use an application of the form furnished by the Department. This rule is authorized under Section 5 of this Act.

2. Any person, firm or corporation, agent or dealer who shall knowingly include in any shipment of nursery stock, or parcel of trees, shrubs

or plants delivered to customers, any trees, plants or shrubs infected with any dangerous fungus diseases or serious insect pest shall be adjudged guilty of a "false representation," both in the delivery of said trees, plants and shrubs, as well as in securing a certificate, and will be punished according to the penalties in Section 4 of this Act.

To more specifically fix responsibility and facilitate action by the Commissioner of Agriculture or his duly authorized agent, the following form of obligation is first required to be executed by each person, firm or corporation asking that a certificate be issued them:

FORM OF OBLIGATION.

The undersigned hereby obligates himself not to offer for shipment any nursery stock, or to deliver any nursery stock to any customer, except such as is free from serious insect pests or dangerous fungus disease, and such as has already been inspected by some duly authorized inspector, and bears a printed copy of a valid certificate of inspection as provided by law.

3. The following classification shall be observed in determining the fees to be collected for any given inspection:

4. When forest or shade trees are not grown in nursery rows, but are to be taken from the forest or woodlands and offered for sale, the person, firm or corporation desiring to make sale of any such trees shall first collect same from the forest and heel them in at some suitable locality, which locality shall be designated as the "sales yard." Upon notice that this has been done a duly authorized representative of the Department will be designated to inspect the premises and such forest and shade trees as are found thereon. Any certificate issued shall apply only to such forest and shade trees as are found on any given sales yard at the time of inspection. Any additional forest or shade trees from forest or woodlands proposed to be sent out under any such certificate will first require an inspection, which further inspection will necessitate an additional fee. This rule is promulgated under Section 8 of this Act.

5. All forest, shade or other trees grown by any person, firm or corporation, and which are to be sold, are classed as nursery stock within the meaning of Section 8 and require an inspection.

6. All orchard trees, vineyards, hedges, or any trees, plants or shrubs from which scions, cuttings or sprouts are to be taken and sold are classed as nursery stock within the meaning of Section 8 of this Act, and require an inspection.

7. Dealers in nursery stock are required to have an inspection of the premises on which their nursery stock is kept for sale, or prepared for shipment, and they shall pay a fee for such inspection as provided for under Rule 4, Section 5, of this Act.

All dealers shall comply with the provisions of the nursery inspection law and the rules and regulations of this Department in reference thereto. They are held to be liable to all penalties provided for any violations of this Act and the rules and regulations authorized by it.

8. The following form of "agent's credential" is required under Section 8 of this Act. This applies to all agents of nurseries or dealers, whether such agents shall sell nursery stock or only make delivery of same. Any person failing to provide his agent, or agents, with a properly executed credential is required, and yet, authorizes him to sell or delivery nursery stock, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of the inspection law under Section 4 of this Act.

To the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas, and All Others Whom It May Concern:

is duly appointed and recognized by me, or us, as my, or our, agent for the sale and delivery of nursery stock in the State of Texas. That I, or we, designate _____, Texas, as our domicile in Texas, and designate _____, or _____, as our legal representative in charge of said domicile. I, or we, waive jurisdiction and will accept service through said agent at our domicile in all legal actions which may become necessary. I, or we, assume responsibility for the acts of said agent designated herein so far as the same are involved in violations of the Inspection Laws of the State of Texas, and the rules and regulations of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Florist, Dealer or Nurseryman.

Agents should at all times be ready to present their credentials upon demand. Any agent selling or delivering nursery stock without such credentials should be classed as a "dealer" under Section 8 of this Act, and shall observe and obey all the laws, rules and regulations relating to dealers. He shall also be liable for any penalties designated for dealers who are guilty of violations of this Act.

9. All cape jasmine bushes, from which it is proposed to cut buds, flowers or cuttings, for the purpose of selling consigning or shipping of such buds, flowers or cuttings, shall first be inspected by a duly authorized representative of this Department. Application shall be made for such inspection on the regular form of the Department for that purpose, and such fee as established under Rule 3 shall be collected for such inspection. If found free from serious insect pests or dangerous fungus diseases a certificate will be issued.

This rule is promulgated under Section 8, which provides that "cut flowers" taken from plants, bushes, shrubs or other trees growing in the

State which are liable to be a medium for disseminating injurious insect pests and contagious diseases shall be classed as "nursery stock," and under Section 9, which requires the Commissioner to provide rules and regulations for the traffic in cut flowers classed as nursery stock.

10. It is hereby provided that the following form shall be used by any duly authorized representative of this Department in giving legal notice to the officers of a city administration, to owners of private parks, or owners of city residences, or owners of city property generally. Any officer or person receiving such notice shall observe all the provisions of this Act and the rules and regulations provided by the Commissioner of Agriculture in reference thereto. They shall also be liable for the penalties provided for any acts of disobedience or violations of any such laws, rules and regulations, the same as provided for such acts of other persons, firms or corporations.

FORM OF NOTIFICATION.

To _____, Texas, 192____

This is to notify you as required by Section 1 of this Act providing for the inspection of nurseries, orchards, greenhouses, city parks, etc., that the following trees, plants and shrubs which are designated below are infested as indicated, and that they are hereby declared a public nuisance as provided under Section 1 of this Act.

Name of trees, plants, or shrubs. Pest or disease.

Under authority of Section 1 of this Act you are hereby ordered to burn the following trees, plants or shrubs. (Inspectors will designate where located.)

You are further hereby instructed to treat the following trees, plants and shrubs as indicated below:

Name of tree, etc. Pest or disease. Treatment.

Under Section 1 you are allowed ten days within which to execute these orders and instructions.

Notice is also hereby given that after the expiration of said ten days the Commissioner of Agriculture, or his duly authorized agent, will proceed under authority of Section 1 to enforce the orders and instructions issued in this notice.

COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE.

NURSERY PRODUCTS—RELATING TO SALE OF.

CHAPTER 160.

An Act to prohibit the vendors of nursery products, their agents, servants and employes, from defrauding vendees, and providing penalties for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. That any person, persons, company of persons, co-partnership, any member of a company or co-partnership, and corporations or any stockholder or officer thereof, any agent, servant or employe of any such person, persons, company of persons, co-partnership, member or stockholder of any company, co-partnership or corporation or officer aforesaid, who shall hereafter knowingly make any false representation or representations, of the name, quality or nature of any nursery product for the purpose

of inducing any vendee to buy the same, or who shall deliver to any vendee knowingly any such product other than that contracted for, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the county jail not less than thirty days nor more than six months, or both so fined and imprisoned.

SEC. 2. The statute of limitation shall not begin to run against a prosecution under the foregoing section until such product shall have developed and disclosed a fraud.

SEC. 3. Any vendee defrauded in violation of this Act shall be entitled to recover full damages at any time within two years after his discovery of the fraud.

**PROMULGATION OF REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO DESTINATION
INSPECTION OF NURSERY STOCK SHIPPED TO THE RIO
GRANDE VALLEY OF TEXAS, AS AUTHORIZED BY
SECTION 5, OF THE TEXAS ORCHARD AND
NURSERY INSPECTION LAW, CHAPTER
19, "GENERAL LAWS OF TEXAS,"
THIRTY-FIRST LEGISLA-
TURE, 1909.**

WHEREAS, Citrus canker, *Pseudomonas citri*, Hasse, a dangerous disease of citrus plants, is now known to exist in certain localities of the State of Texas, and

WHEREAS, The unrestricted shipping of nursery and floral stock from certain territories in which citrus canker has been found, or where such conditions exist as would render it a possible source of infection, might result in the introduction of this dangerous plant disease into such citrus localities as are now free from citrus canker, and

WHEREAS, The introduction of foreign and injurious plant pests from States where such pests are present and where climatic conditions or other circumstances, do not permit the pests becoming excessively injurious, would mean in certain cases probable destruction of the citrus industry, and in any case a burden to the industry and the taxpayers of this State:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Geo. B. Terrell, Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas, in order to prevent the further dissemination of the aforesaid citrus canker, and to prevent its introduction, together with other dangerous pests, from other States and foreign countries, and to control and eradicate them where they now exist in this State do hereby promulgate the following regulations as provided for in Section 5, Chapter 19, General Laws of the State of Texas, First Called Session of the Thirty-first Legislature; and amended 1921 in Chapter 49, General Laws of the State of Texas, Regular Session, Thirty-seventh Legislature.

1. The shipment of nursery and floral stock which has originated in the counties of Brazoria, Chambers, Fort Bend, Galveston, Hardin, Jasper, Harris, Jefferson, Wharton, Jackson, Liberty, Matagorda and Orange, into the Rio Grande Valley citrus district, composed of the counties of Cameron, Willacy, Hidalgo, Starr, Zapata, Jim Hogg, Brooks, Kennedy, Kleberg, Nueces, Jim Wells, Dunn, Duval, Webb, Dimmit, LaSalle, McMullen, Frio and Zavalla is hereby prohibited; except by special permission of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

2. All citrus nursery stock originating outside of the counties of Cameron, Hidalgo and Starr and shipped into these counties must be inspected at point of destination by an authorized inspector before it is released from express office or depot.

3. All classes of nursery stock originating in the counties of Brazoria, Chambers, Fort Bend, Galveston, Hardin, Wharton, Jackson, Harris, Jefferson, Liberty, Matagorda and Orange, and which has been granted special permission by the Commissioner of Agriculture to enter the counties of Cameron, Hidalgo and Starr must be inspected at destination for proper authorization for shipment or otherwise by an authorized inspector of the State Department of Agriculture before it is released from express office or depot.

All rules and regulations heretofore promulgated in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE SHIPMENT OF
PLANTS FROM CITRUS CANCKER-INFECTED TERRITORY.**

WHEREAS, Citrus canker, *Pseudomonas citri*, Hasse, a dangerous disease of citrus plants, is now known in certain localities of the State of Texas and in other states of the United States.

WHEREAS, It is made the duty of the Commissioner of Agriculture to promulgate such rules and regulations as shall be demonstrated by scientific research to be effective in the control and eradication of dangerous insect pests and plant diseases.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Geo. B. Terrell, Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas, in order to prevent the further dissemination of the aforesaid citrus canker, and to prevent its introduction from other states and to control and eradicate it where it now exists in this State, do hereby promulgate the following rules and regulations as provided for in Section 5, Chapter 19, General Laws of the State of Texas, First Called Session of the Thirty-first Legislature; and amended 1921 in Chapter 49, General Laws of the State of Texas, Regular Session.

1. The removal of nursery stock or other plants is prohibited from any premise on which citrus canker is found until such time as, in the judgment of the Commissioner of Agriculture, the dangerous condition may have ceased to exist.

2. The removal of citrus trees or plants grown within one mile of a premise infected with citrus canker is hereby prohibited, except upon special permission from the Commissioner of Agriculture, providing that in no case shall they be removed to a distance exceeding one mile from center of infection, until such time as, in the judgment of the Commissioner of Agriculture, the dangerous condition may have ceased to exist.

3. The removal of citrus trees or plants grown within two miles and more than one mile, of a premise infected with citrus canker is hereby prohibited, except by special permission of the Commissioner of Agriculture, provided that in no case shall they be removed to a distance exceeding ten miles from infection until such time as, in the judgment of the Commissioner of Agriculture, the dangerous condition may have ceased to exist.

4. The removal of trees and plants other than citrus, grown within one mile of citrus canker infection, is hereby prohibited except in such limits as may be defined by the Commissioner of Agriculture and until such time as, in the judgment of the Commissioner of Agriculture, the dangerous condition shall have ceased to exist.

All rules and regulations heretofore promulgated in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS
COVERING THE SHIPMENT OF NURSERY
STOCK INTO TEXAS FROM OTHER
STATES.**

In pursuance of Articles 119, 128, 129, 130, 131, Chapter 7, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas of 1925, I, Geo. B. Terrell, Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas, do hereby promulgate the following rules and regulations governing the shipment of nursery and floral stock into this State:

1. No individual, firm or corporation outside of the State shall be permitted to ship nursery or floral stock into this State without first securing a general nursery license from the Commissioner of Agriculture, providing, however, that such general license does not apply to nor cover citrus nurser

stock. All nurserymen applying for a general nursery license to operate in Texas must comply with the following regulations:

2. Applicants for said license must file with the Texas State Department of Agriculture a certified copy of certificate of inspection from the State Inspector of the State in which the nursery stock originates and a fee of five dollars (\$5.00), as required by law. The fee must be remitted in post office money order, cashier's check or bank draft.

3. Applications must be presented on official forms to the Commissioner of Agriculture agreeing to furnish to said Commissioner copy of all invoices or memorandum of each and every shipment of stock made into this State, giving the date, consignor, consignee, and list of such stock shipped. Such invoices or memorandum must be sent at time of each shipment or not later than two weeks thereafter.

4. Before issuing a nursery certificate for any out-of-state nursery the Commissioner of Agriculture will satisfy himself, chiefly from information derived from the Nursery Inspection Division from the state in which the applicant is located, as to whether or not the nursery of the applicant is infested with pests not known to exist in this State, and as to whether or not the nursery is located sufficiently close to an infection or an infestation of any such pests that would cause the importation of trees from the nursery in question to be a possible means of introducing new pests into this State. In no case, however, will any nursery or floral stock grown or located within ten miles of a recent infestation of camphor scale, black scale or any other pest not known to exist in this State be subject to delivery in this State.

5. Upon receipt of such application, fee and certified copy of certificate and other information as provided for above, the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas shall make further investigation as to the moral standing and integrity of the applicant as will satisfy him that the applicant is entitled to receive a permit to ship into this State and as to the probability of such applicant abiding by the provisions of these regulations. If, in his judgment, such applicant is entitled to receive a permit to ship into this State, then such permit shall be granted, which shall expire August 31st next following the date of issue.

6. The Commissioner of Agriculture reserves the right to cancel any license issued when, in his judgment, any of the regulations herein promulgated have been violated, or upon receipt of authentic information regarding new developments with reference to the insect and disease situation that would warrant such action for the protection of the horticultural interest of this State.

7. The Commissioner of Agriculture also reserves the right to refuse for delivery any shipment of nursery stock made into this State in violation of these regulations or any shipment that is found to be infested with injurious insects or disease. The shipper in such cases will be offered the option of having the stock returned him at his expense or having it destroyed at the destination depot.

8. All shipments of nursery or floral stock originating outside of the State of Texas must bear shipping tags showing the exact copy of certificate of inspection from the State Inspector of the State in which the shipment originated, and in addition thereto must have a tag showing the exact copy of permit from Texas. The shipper must have these tags printed.

9. Freight and express companies of this State are prohibited from delivering any shipment of nursery or floral stock which does not bear the proper tags showing copies of necessary permits and they shall not be held liable for any damages for refusing to deliver any nursery stock shipped in violation of these regulations.

10. No agent or dealer representing any out-of-state nursery or florist shall be permitted to operate in Texas without first securing proper credentials from the Commissioner of Agriculture of this State. Forms for these credentials, approved by the Commissioner of Agriculture, are furnished free of charge. Each agent or dealer must be prepared to present such credentials at all times.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING SHIPMENTS OF CITRUS STOCK INTO TEXAS.

1. No individual, firm or corporation outside of the State shall be permitted to ship citrus nursery stock into this State without first securing from the Commissioner of Agriculture of Texas a *special citrus license*. Any nursery man applying for the special citrus license must comply with all the requirements specified for a general nursery license and in addition thereto must conform with the following regulations:

2. The applicant shall be a person, firm or corporation of good character and reputation for honesty, competency and fair dealing.

3. Any applicant for a Special Citrus License must furnish and file a bond of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) with the Commissioner of Agriculture of Texas, guaranteeing the fulfillment of the applicant's contract covering all citrus tree sales made in this State, and protecting the purchaser against losses occurring from any misrepresentation or failure on the part of the applicant to comply with his contract. The bond must further provide that the venue of any suit brought to recover on such bond shall be in the county where the particular shipment of citrus stock in question is delivered. The said bond must be taken out with a company authorized to do business in Texas and actually doing business in the State, and shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Agriculture of Texas.

4. Before issuing a special citrus license for any out-of-state nursery the Commissioner of Agriculture will satisfy himself, chiefly from information derived from the Nursery Inspection Division from the State in which the applicant is located, as to whether or not the nursery of the applicant is infested with pests not known to exist in the main citrus belt of this State and as to whether or not the nursery is located sufficiently close to an infection or an infestation of any such pests that would cause the importation of trees from the nursery in question to be a possible means of introducing new pests into this State. In no case will any citrus nursery stock grown or located within ten miles of an infection of *citrus canker*, *scaly bark*, *camphor scale* or *black scale* be subject to delivery in this State.

5. All citrus stock shipped into this State must be free from injurious insects and diseases.

6. All citrus nursery stock must be defoliated, washed and scrubbed in a standard oil emulsion solution or whale oil soap solution and re-inspected at the time of packing for shipment. Such re-inspection, washing and scrubbing must be done under the supervision of a State Inspector, and each shipment must be accompanied with a statement to that effect signed by the State Inspector.

7. Every box, bale, or package of citrus nursery stock originating outside of the State must bear a tag on which is printed an exact copy of the *special citrus certificate* of this State and also an exact copy of the certificate of the State from which the shipment was made. It is not required that citrus shipments bear a Texas *general nursery inspection certificate*.

8. All citrus nursery stock shipped into this State must be labeled as to age, variety, and root stock.

9. All applicants for special citrus licenses must submit to the Commissioner of Agriculture a statement signed both by the applicant and the Chief Nursery Inspector of that State, showing the number of each variety of citrus stock growing on the properties of the applicant upon which special shipping permit is requested. Such applicant must also agree to ship into Texas only such citrus stock as is grown in their own nurseries and that which is covered by an official inspection certificate furnished the Texas Department of Agriculture by the Nursery Inspector of the State in which such stock originates.

10. The Commissioner of Agriculture reserves the right to cancel any license issued, when in his judgment any of the regulation herein promulgated have been violated, or upon receipt of authentic information regarding new developments with reference to the insect and disease situation that would warrant such action for the protection of the horticultural interest of this State.

11. The Commissioner of Agriculture also reserves the right to refuse for delivery any shipment of citrus stock made into this State in violation of these regulations or any shipment that is found to be infested with injurious

insects or diseases. The shipper, in all such cases, will be offered the option of having the stock returned to him at his expense or having it destroyed at the destination depot.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING IMPORTATION OF CITRUS SEED.

1. No individual, firm, or corporation shall be permitted to import citrus seed into this State without first furnishing the Commissioner of Agriculture a certified statement from their State Plant Board that the seed were gathered from a citrus canker-free territory, and also an affidavit that the seed to be shipped were treated in a corrosive sublimate solution of a strength of 1/1000.

WHEREAS, The undersigned has applied to the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas for a license authorizing it, him or them to ship citrus stock into said State; and

WHEREAS, The said Commissioner of Agriculture has issued certain regulations governing such shipments into said State;

Now, THEREFORE, We, the said _____, as principal, and the other subscribers hereto, as sureties, do acknowledge ourselves indebted to and held and firmly bound and obligated to pay the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas the penal sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), to be held for the use and benefit of any person or persons who may be injured by the failure of the principal to comply with any contract entered into by said principal involving the shipment of citrus stock into Texas, or by any misrepresentations made by the principal regarding such shipments; for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we do jointly and severally bind ourselves, our legal representative, successors and assigns, firmly by these presents.

In case of suit for recovery on this bond, the sureties hereby agree that the venue of said suit for recovery shall be in the district court of the county to which the nursery stock involved in the controversy was shipped, or was to be shipped.

Condition of this obligation is such, however, that should the said principal faithfully comply with all representations and contracts made or entered into by said principal involving the shipment citrus stock into Texas, and with the regulations promulgated by the Commissioner of Agriculture of Texas governing such shipments, then this obligation is to be null and void, otherwise it is to remain in full force and effect one year from date.

**PROMULGATIONS PROHIBITING THE SHIPPING OF LIME AND
LEMON TREES, SCIONS, AND BUDS FROM THE STATE
OF FLORIDA INTO THE STATE OF TEXAS.**

WHEREAS, A dangerously injurious plant disease known as withertip of limes, *Gloeosporium limeticolum*, is known to exist in the State of Florida; and,

WHEREAS, This disease is not known to exist in Texas; and,

WHEREAS, This disease may be spread from one State to another through movements of lime and lemon nursery stock;

THEREFORE, I, Geo. B. Terrell, Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas, by virtue of the power conferred upon me by Articles 119, 128, 130, 131, Chapter 7, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas of 1925, do hereby prohibit the movement into the State of Texas of any lime and lemon trees or scions and buds thereof, from the State of Florida, in order to prevent the introduction of this disease in the State of Texas.

This order shall take effect on the date hereof and remain in full force and effect until further ordered.

NARCISSUS BULB QUARANTINE.

Hon. W. M. Jardine, Secretary of Agriculture, has made announcements through the Federal Horticultural Board that the Narcissus Bulb Quarantine No. 62 became effective on July 15, 1926; and has promulgated the quarantine with the following regulations:

It is expected that the different State regulatory boards, especially of such States where narcissus bulbs are being grown, will issue similar quarantines paralleling the Federal measures, so that both interstate and intrastate movement of narcissus bulbs may be safeguarded.

For the information of the bulb growers and general public of Texas, we are publishing herewith the statement issued by the United States Department of Agriculture as well as the Federal quarantine and regulation, and also regulations as promulgated by the Commissioner of Agriculture of Texas.

All growers of narcissus bulbs who contemplate making shipments should communicate with the Chief Nursery Inspector, Department of Agriculture, Austin, Texas.

NARCISSUS BULB QUARANTINE.

(Effective July 15, 1926.)

The domestic narcissus bulb quarantine proposed to prevent the spread of bulb flies and eelworm pests was signed July 3rd by Secretary of Agriculture, to become effective July 15, 1926. The tentative regulation submitted June 15th to all interested parties for comment was received with general approval, no criticisms or changes being suggested.

The quarantine applies only to the American-grown bulb crop, but involves commercial growers, shippers, and handlers of domestic narcissus bulbs in every State and district of the United States. It provides for the movement of the bulbs only after inspection and certification. Bulbs found free from infestation will be certified for interstate movement. Bulbs found to be infested will not be allowed in interstate movement until disinfected or treated under the direction and to the satisfaction of an inspector. Persons intending to move harvested bulbs interstate should make application for inspection to the plant quarantine inspector of the State concerned as far as possible in advance of the probable date of shipment.

NARCISSUS BULB QUARANTINE.

Notice of Quarantine No. 62.

(Effective on and after July 15, 1926.)

I, William M. Jardine, Secretary of Agriculture, have determined that it is necessary to quarantine each and every State of the Continental United States and the District of Columbia, in order to prevent the spread of certain injurious bulb pests, including the greater bulb fly (*Merodon equestris*, Fab.), the lesser bulb fly (*Eumerus strigatus*, Fallen), and the bulb eelworm (*Tylenchus dipsaci*, Kuehn), not heretofore widely prevalent or distributed within and throughout the United States.

Now, therefore, under authority conferred by the Plant Quarantine Act of August 20, 1912 (37 Stat., 315), as amended by the Act of Congress, approved March 4, 1917 (39 Stat., 1134, 1165), and having duly given the public hearing required thereby, I do quarantine every State in the Continental United States and the District of Columbia, effective on and after July 15, 1926. Hereafter, under the authority of said Act of August 20, 1912, amended as aforesaid, no narcissus bulbs shall be shipped, offered for shipment to a common carrier, received for transportation, or carried by a common carrier, or carrier, transported, moved, or allowed to be moved interstate in manner or method or under conditions other than those prescribed in the rules and regulations hereinafter made and amendments thereto.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS SUPPLEMENTAL TO NOTICE OF
QUARANTINE NO. 62.**

Regulation 1. Definitions.

Narcissus bulbs: Bulbs of the genus narcissus, including Paper Whites, Daffodils, Jonquils, the so-called Chinese Sacred Lily or Chinese Narcissus, and other species of this genus.

Bulb flies: The greater bulb fly (*Merodon equestris*, Fab.) and the lesser bulb fly (*Eumerus strigatus*, Fallen).

Eelworms: *Tylenchus dipsaci*, Kuehn, and any other eelworms attacking narcissus bulbs.

Inspector: Either (a) an inspector of the United States Department of Agriculture, or (b) an official State inspector duly commissioned to act also as an inspector of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Certificates: The certification as a condition of interstate movement required in Regulation 3.

Regulation 2. Restrictions on Interstate Movement of Narcissus Bulbs.

The restrictions on the movement of narcissus bulbs covered in this Notice of Quarantine No. 62 and in the rules and regulations supplemental thereto shall apply to all species and varieties of narcissus bulbs offered for interstate transportation in any State of the Continental United States or the District of Columbia: *Provided*, That no restrictions are placed by these regulations on the movement of cut flowers of narcissus.

Regulation 3. Conditions Governing Interstate Movement of Narcissus Bulbs.

No interstate movement of narcissus bulbs will be allowed except upon compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (a) or (b) and (c) and (d) following:

(a) The interstate movement of narcissus bulbs will not be allowed un-

less and until such bulbs have been certified by an inspector to be apparently free from infestation with bulb flies and eelworms on the basis of both field and crop inspection as provided for in Appendix A.

(b) The interstate movement of narcissus bulbs, which have been determined by such inspection as is required under (a) to be clearly infested with bulb flies or eelworms or both, shall not be allowed unless and until such bulbs have been disinfected or treated, under the direction of, and in manner satisfactory to, the inspector, and so certified by the inspector, as indicated in Appendix B.

(c)* As a condition for the certification provided for in (a) and (b) above, the grower will be required to present, in the form of an affirmation (see Appendix C), evidence satisfactory to the said inspector that prior to the planting of the crop concerned, all of the planting stock, unless certified as above as apparently uninfested, was disinfected in the same manner and method as herein required as a condition of interstate movement of the resulting crop.

(d) The issuance of certificates shall be conditioned upon the State requiring, as a condition of intrastate movement, that all bulbs produced for distribution or sale in the State shall be given the inspection and certification and, if found to be infested, the treatment, required in this regulation for interstate movement.

Based on the inspection required in this regulation, the inspector designated for the State concerned will issue to each grower a certificate either of inspection or disinfection, as required by (a) or (b) hereof, and such number of shipping certificates based thereon as may be necessary for the movement of the crop certified. Such certificates will be issued only for the bulbs which have actually been inspected by the inspector and the use of such certificates in connection with bulbs which have not been inspected as provided in this regulation is unlawful: *Provided*, That certification of stock assembled from a number of growers shall be conditioned on the prior inspection and certification as required in this regulation of the plantings and crops of the individual growers concerned.

Regulation 4. Conditions Governing Field Inspection of the Growing Bulbs.

Persons growing narcissus bulbs with the intention of requesting certification for movement of the crop interstate shall make application for field inspection as far as possible in advance of the probable date required for such inspection to the inspector designated for the State concerned.

Regulation 5. Conditions Governing Inspection of Harvested Bulbs.

Persons intending to move or to allow to be moved interstate harvested narcissus bulbs shall make application therefor as far as possible in advance of the probable date of movement to the inspector designated for the State concerned. Application should show the quantity of the bulbs which it is proposed to move, together with exact location and, if practicable, the contemplated date or period of shipment. Applicants will be required to assemble the bulbs to be inspected and so to place them that they can be readily examined. If not so placed, inspection may be refused.

Regulation 6. Marking Requirements for Interstate Movement.

Every crate, box, or other container of narcissus bulbs offered for interstate movement shall have securely attached to it the appropriate shipping certificate as provided for in Regulation 3. In the case of a carload lot or other bulk shipment, such certificate shall accompany the waybill, conductor's manifest, memorandum, or bill of lading pertaining to the shipment.

Such certification shall remain and continue as a condition of any re-shipments in original containers for interstate movement of such certified bulbs, but shall not be required with respect to retail sales of broken lots taken from certified shipments.

Regulation 7. Penalties for Violation of Regulations.

Outstanding certificates may be withdrawn and further certification may be refused as to any grower or shipper who has violated any of the rules and regulations herein provided governing the interstate movement of narcissus

bulbs or who has falsely labeled or mislabeled any shipment with the intent of evading any of the provisions of these rules and regulations.

The above rules and regulations are hereby adopted and shall be effective on and after July 15, 1926.

APPENDIX "A."

Inspection of Narcissus as a Condition of Issuance of Certificates Covering Bulbs to be Shipped Interstate.

The inspection required under these regulations includes two examinations* the first in the field, to be made during the growing period approximately at the middle of the flowering period; and the second at time the bulbs are lifted, or if more convenient, in the storage sheds prior to shipment.

APPENDIX "B."

Treatment of Bulbs Infested With Bulb Flies or Eelworms.

Plantings of narcissus bulbs found, as a result of field or storage shed inspection, to be infested with bulb flies or eelworms, as a condition of certification for interstate movement must be sterilized by the hot water method or other treatment approved by the inspector.

The Hot Water Treatment for Bulb Flies and Eelworms.

This treatment involves the submersion of the bulbs in wire baskets, slat boxes, or other containers, in water ranging in temperature from 110° to 111.5° F. for a period of not less than two and one-half hours. The range of temperature during this period shall not fall below 110° F. and for the safety of the bulbs, should not exceed 111.5° F. In order that all bulbs may be exposed to the same temperature, the water should be agitated or circulated during the period of treatment so that a uniform temperature is maintained throughout the sterilization tank. To prevent heating of the bulbs following the treatment, it is desirable that they be plunged into or syringed with cold water promptly or removal from the sterilizer. Bulbs which are not intended for immediate planting should be dried by some means, mechanical or otherwise, before storage or shipment.

The Carbon Disulphide Treatment for Bulb Flies.

Experimental work conducted in California indicates that the vacuum method of fumigation with carbon disulphide is effective against the bulb flies. In the event therefore that inspection reveals that the bulbs are infested with bulb flies only, the grower may have the optional treatment of vacuum fumigation. This treatment should not be given until the bulbs have been thoroughly cured and freed from all dirt and debris. Previous to the introduction of carbon disulphide into the fumigation tank, a 27" mercurial vacuum should be produced. The dosage shall be not less than 2½ pounds nor more than 3 pounds, per 100 cubic feet of space. The period of exposure shall not be less than 1¾ hours, nor more than 2 hours, computed from the time the indicator on the vacuum gage reaches zero. Bulbs, when removed from the fumigator, should be thoroughly aired and should not be immediately brought into the direct sun rays or wind. Bulbs should not be fumigated when the atmosphere is below 60° F. The optimum temperature conditions are between 70° and 80° F. with a limit of 10° either way as a tolerance.

*In view of the lateness of the season, the issuance of certificates for the shipping season 1926 may be based on one inspection to be made at the time of lifting or prior to shipment.

RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE SALE AND MOVEMENT OF NARCISSEUS BULBS IN TEXAS.

WHEREAS, The Secretary of Agriculture of the United States Department of Agriculture has determined that it is necessary to quarantine each and every State of the continental United States in order to prevent the spread of certain injurious bulb pests, including the greater bulb fly (*Merodon equestris*, Fab.), the lesser bulb fly (*Eumerus strigatus*, Fallen), and the bulb eelworm (*Tylenchus dipsaci*, Kuehn), not heretofore widely prevalent or distributed within and throughout the United States; and,

WHEREAS, The Secretary of Agriculture has promulgated certain rules and regulations relative to interstate shipment of bulbs; and,

WHEREAS, Bulb-growing in Texas promises to become an important industry and should be protected against the spread of the above named bulb pests, should they occur in Texas; and,

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of Agriculture is given authority under Chapter 7, Articles 119, 123, 129, 130 and 131, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas of 1925, to promulgate such reasonable regulations as would give adequate protection against the spread of such pests in this State;

Now, THEREFORE, Under the authority conferred by the Civil Statutes referred to above, I do hereby adopt the interstate rules and regulations relative to Quarantine 62, promulgated by the Secretary of Agriculture, July 3, 1926, to apply to all narcissus bulbs offered for sale or for shipment in this State. Provided, however, that State certification and State tags, as herein-after explained, shall govern the intrastate movement of such bulbs in Texas.

Any person in the State of Texas who desires to grow and offer for sale bulbs must make application to the Commissioner of Agriculture at Austin, Texas, prior to June 10th of each year, for a "Special Bulb Permit" and for the necessary inspection, as provided for in the regulations hereby adopted.

It is hereby further ordered that no narcissus bulbs shall be offered for sale from any nursery, field, or plantation in the State, except from such places as have been inspected and certified as being substantially free from injurious plant pests and accompanied by an authorized "Speical Certificate of Bulb Inspection" issued by the State Department of Agriculture.
