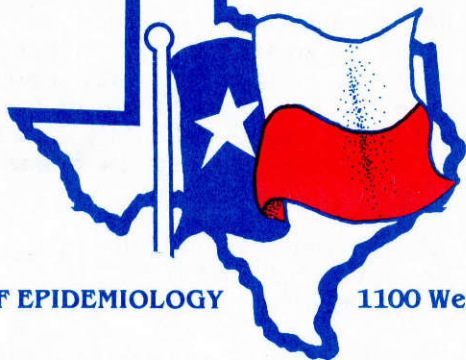

AN OUTBREAK OF ST. LOUIS ENCEPHALITIS IN BEAUMONT - AUGUST, 1982

During the first week of August, 1982, six patients were admitted to hospitals in Beaumont (Jefferson County) with histories of recent onset of high fever and neurologic impairment. One neurologist was asked to consult on five of the cases. His diagnosis was viral encephalitis. He was aware that St. Louis encephalitis (SLE) virus had caused an outbreak of encephalitis in Jefferson County in 1980 and suspected that these patients might represent the start of another outbreak. He immediately notified the local mosquito control district, local health department, and the Texas Department of Health (TDH).

The Jefferson County Mosquito Control District encourages reporting of viral encephalitis during the late summer and fall months and conducts mosquito control projects year round. In response to notification of a suspected case of SLE, they investigate the individual's home, work place, and recreational sites for potential exposure to vector mosquitoes and intensify control efforts if problem areas are identified.

Beaumont, like many other Gulf Coast cities, has a storm sewer system in the city proper to accommodate torrential rainfall. These large concrete tunnels have been shown to provide excellent breeding and resting sites for the vector mosquito of SLE, Culex quinquefasciatus. The Jefferson County Mosquito Control District has developed techniques to monitor mosquito populations in these tunnels and to introduce insecticides directly into storm sewers when necessary.

In addition to vector control measures, the District also has established an informal network of communications with the medical staff in hospitals throughout the county for early notification of suspect SLE cases. This network, which functioned effectively in 1980 when cases were scattered throughout the eastern half of the county, was used for the first time in western Jefferson County during this outbreak in Beaumont.

Investigation revealed that all six of the suspect cases lived in downtown Beaumont and that two individuals were employed at the same plant. Across the street from the plant was a large vacant housing development with several evident sewer leaks. With permission from the owners, mosquito control district personnel conducted insecticide spraying inside the development.

Three of the six cases were confirmed as SLE during the first week of September, two others in mid and late September. The remaining case, a child, moved out of the area and was lost to follow up. The month-long interval between onset of illness and diagnosis is not atypical and reflects the fact that confirmation is based on a four-fold rise in antibody titer between serum samples drawn at least two weeks apart. The paired sera must then be sent to the TDH laboratories where complement fixation

and hemagglutination inhibition tests are performed. These tests are available at only two laboratories in the state because they are not routine; rather, they require experienced personnel and such obscure reagents as fresh goose red blood cells. Delaying mosquito abatement efforts until a case had been confirmed would have prolonged exposure and resulted in additional SLE cases. Only two additional SLE cases were reported in Beaumont during 1982, and both resided in areas distant from the original cases.

Control of this outbreak can be attributed to the experience, planning, cooperation, communication, and prompt action of all personnel involved. It is an excellent example of collaboration between the public and private health care sectors.
