13	SECTION 1.02. Section 1001.002, Occupations Code, is
14	amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (3) to

16	(1) "Board" means the Texas Board of Professional

18	(3) "Land surveyor," "licensed state land surveyor,"
19	"professional surveying," "registered professional land surveyor,"

22	SECTION 1.03. Section 1001.004(e), Occupations Code, is
23	amended to read as follows:

 the person is affiliated;

7 (h) The Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land</u>
8 <u>Surveyors</u> has exclusive regulatory oversight over an engineer
9 listed under Subsection (a).

SECTION 2.14. Section 223.151, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 223.151. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter:

(1) applies to services of a technical expert, including an archeologist, biologist, geologist, or historian, to conduct an environmental or cultural assessment required by state or federal law for a transportation project under the authority or jurisdiction of the department; and

18 (2) does not apply to services defined as engineering
19 by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u>
20 under Chapter 1001, Occupations Code.

21 SECTION 2.15. Section 26.3573(u), Water Code, is amended to 22 read as follows:

(u) The petroleum storage tank remediation account may not be used to pay for a site remediation that involves the installation or construction of on-site equipment, structures, or systems used in the extraction or management of wastes, except for soil excavation and landfill disposal or well sampling and monitoring,

1 unless:

(1) the plans and specifications for the equipment,
3 structures, or systems are sealed by an engineer licensed by the
4 Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u>; and

5 (2) the equipment, structures, or systems are 6 constructed under the supervision of an engineer licensed by the 7 Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u>.

8 SECTION 2.16. Sections 26.364(b), (c), and (e), Water Code, 9 are amended to read as follows:

(b) The commission, on the request of an engineer licensed
by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u>,
shall register the engineer in the program.

13 (c) An engineer registered in the program may contract to 14 perform corrective action under this subchapter unless the Texas 15 Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u> determines the 16 engineer is not qualified to perform a corrective action.

(e) The commission may not adopt minimum qualifications for an engineer licensed by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u> to contract with an eligible owner or operator to perform a corrective action under this subchapter.

21 SECTION 2.17. Sections 26.366(b), (c), and (e), Water Code, 22 are amended to read as follows:

(b) The commission, on the request of an engineer licensed
by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u>,
shall license the engineer in the program.

26 (c) An engineer licensed in the program may supervise a27 corrective action under this subchapter unless the Texas Board of

Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u> determines the engineer
 is not qualified to supervise a corrective action.

ARTICLE 3. TRANSITIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 3.01. (a) The Texas Board of Professional Land 8 Surveying is abolished but continues in existence until September 9 10 2020, for the sole purpose of transferring obligations, 1, 11 property, rights, powers, and duties to the Texas Board of 12 Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors as created by this Act. 13 The Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors 14 assumes all of the obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties of the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying as they 15 16 exist immediately before the effective date of this Act. All 17 unexpended funds appropriated to the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying are transferred to the Texas Board of Professional 18 Engineers and Land Surveyors. 19

(b) The Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors and the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying shall, in consultation with appropriate state entities, ensure that the transfer of the obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties of the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying to the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors is completed not later than September 1, 2020.

(c) All rules of the Texas Board of Professional Land

Surveying are continued in effect as rules of the Texas Board of 1 2 Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors until superseded by a rule of the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land 3 4 Surveyors. A certificate, license, registration, or other authorization issued by the Texas Board of Professional Land 5 Surveying is continued in effect as provided by the law in effect 6 7 immediately before the effective date of this Act. An application for a certificate, license, registration, or other authorization 8 9 pending on the effective date of this Act is continued without 10 change in status after the effective date of this Act. A complaint, investigation, contested case, or other proceeding pending on the 11 effective date of this Act is continued without change in status 12 13 after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3.02. The change in law made by this Act to Section 14 15 1001.101, Occupations Code, does not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the Texas Board of Professional Engineers 16 17 immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to 18 serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the terms of board members expire, the governor shall appoint or reappoint members to 19 20 the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors who 21 have the qualifications required for members under Sections 22 1001.101 and 1001.102, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 3.03. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this section, Section 1001.112, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies to a member of the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

A member of a board who, before the effective date of 1 (b) 2 this Act, completed the training program required by Section 1001.112, Occupations Code, as that section existed before the 3 4 effective date of this Act, is required to complete additional training only on the subjects added by this Act to the training 5 program. A board member described by this subsection may not vote, 6 7 deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of the board held on or after September 1, 2020, until the member 8 9 completes the additional training.

10 SECTION 3.04. Sections 1001.272 and 1001.277, Occupations Code, as transferred, redesignated, and amended by this Act, with 11 12 respect to an application for a license or registration or renewal 13 of a license or registration for a registered professional land surveyor or licensed state land surveyor, apply only to an 14 application filed with the Texas Board of Professional Engineers 15 and Land Surveyors on or after September 1, 2020. An application 16 17 filed before September 1, 2020, is governed by the law in effect 18 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 19

20 SECTION 3.05. Section 1071.254(a), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an application 21 for 22 registration as a registered professional land surveyor that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An application 23 for a registration that was filed before the effective date of this 24 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was 25 26 filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 27 SECTION 3.06. To the extent of any conflict, this Act

4 SECTION 3.07. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
