H.B. No. 410

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the regulation of certain low-volume and other
3 livestock processing establishments.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 433.0245, Health and Safety Code, is
6 amended by adding Subsections (a-1), (e), and (f) and amending
7 Subsections (b), (c), and (d) to read as follows:

8 (a-1) For purposes of this section, a low-volume livestock
9 processing establishment:

10 (1) includes an establishment that processes fewer
11 than 10,000 domestic rabbits or more than 1,000 but fewer than
12 10,000 poultry in a calendar year; and

13 (2) does not include an establishment that processes
14 1,000 or fewer poultry raised by the operator of the establishment
15 in a calendar year.

16 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (e) and (f), a [A]
17 low-volume livestock processing establishment that is exempt from
18 federal inspection shall register with the department in accordance
19 with rules adopted by the executive commissioner for registration.

20 (c) Except as provided by Subsections (e) and (f), a [A]
21 low-volume livestock processing establishment that is exempt from
22 federal inspection shall develop a sanitary operation procedures
23 plan.

24 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (f), if [~~f~~]

1 contaminated livestock can be reasonably traced to a low-volume
2 livestock processing establishment that is exempt from federal
3 inspection, the department may request the attorney general or the
4 district or county attorney in the jurisdiction where the facility
5 is located to institute a civil suit to enjoin the operation of the
6 establishment until the department determines that the
7 establishment has been sanitized and is operating safely.


8 (e) A low-volume livestock processing establishment that is
9 exempt from federal inspection and processes fewer than 500
10 domestic rabbits in a calendar year is not required to comply with
11 Subsection (b) or (c).

12 (f) An establishment described by Subsection (a-1)(2):


13 (1) is not subject to additional state regulation; and

14 (2) may sell poultry products directly to consumers.

15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.






