The change in law made by this Act to Section 651.051(a), Occupations Code, does not affect the entitlement of a 18 member serving on the Texas Funeral Service Commission immediately 19 before the effective date of this Act to continue to serve for the 20 remainder of the member's term. As the terms of commission members 21 expire, the governor shall appoint or reappoint members who have 22 23 the qualifications required for members under Section 651.051(a), 24 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

25 SECTION 38. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 26 this section, Section 651.0511, Occupations Code, as amended by 27 this Act, applies to a member of the Texas Funeral Service

1 Commission appointed before, on, or after the effective date of 2 this Act.

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(b) A member of the Texas Funeral Service Commission who, 3 before the effective date of this Act, completed the training 4 program required by Section 651.0511, Occupations Code, as that law 5 6 existed before the effective date of this Act, is required to 7 complete additional training only on subjects added by this Act to the training program as required by Section 651.0511, Occupations 8 Code, as amended by this Act. A member of the commission described 9 by this subsection may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a 10 member in attendance at a meeting of the commission held on or after 11 December 1, 2019, until the member completes the additional 12 13 training.

SECTION 39. Section 651.259(e), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an application for a license submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for a license submitted before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

20 SECTION 40. Section 651.351(g), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an exemption requested by a 21 22 funeral establishment on or after the date the Texas Funeral 23 Service Commission adopts rules providing for the requirements for 24 an exemption under that subsection. A request made before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective 25 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that 26 27 purpose.

651.460(b) and 1 SECTION 41. Sections 651.501(a), 2 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, and Sections 651.460(c), 651.601(a-2), and 651.603, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, 3 4 apply only to conduct that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before that date is governed by the 5 law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law 6 7 is continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 42. The changes made by this Act to Chapter 651, 9 Occupations Code, relating to fees under that chapter apply only to 10 a fee that becomes due on or after the effective date of this Act. A 11 fee that became due before that date is governed by the law in 12 effect on the date the fee became due, and the former law is 13 continued in effect for that purpose.

14 SECTION 43. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 15 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
