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<u>S.B. No. 982</u>

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of disaster and emergency services,
3	including health care services, to certain populations.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 418.054 and 418.055 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 418.054. EMERGENCY PLAN FOR SPECIALTY CARE
8	POPULATIONS. The division, in consultation with the Department of
9	State Health Services and local governmental entities that have
10	established emergency management plans, shall develop a plan to
11	increase the capabilities of local emergency shelters in the
12	provision of shelter and care for specialty care populations during
13	a disaster.
14	Sec. 418.055. ACCESS TO LOCAL VOLUNTEER NETWORKS; VOLUNTEER
15	MOBILE MEDICAL UNITS. (a) The division, in consultation with the
16	Department of State Health Services, shall increase awareness of
17	and encourage local government emergency response teams to utilize
18	services provided by local volunteer networks, including the
19	Medical Reserve Corps, that are available in the area to respond
20	during a disaster or emergency.
21	(b) The division shall develop a plan to create and manage
22	state-controlled volunteer mobile medical units in each public
23	health region to assist counties that lack access to a volunteer
24	network described by Subsection (a).

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1	(c) The Department of State Health Services shall
2	collaborate with local medical organizations that represent
3	licensed physicians who practice in a county or public health
4	region to:
5	(1) ensure the physicians are informed about local
6	government emergency response teams and those teams are aware of
7	physician resources in the county or region, as applicable;
8	(2) compile and maintain a list of physicians in the
9	county or region and the contact information for the physicians;
10	(3) provide up-to-date information about resources
11	for physicians regarding disaster planning, including continuing
12	medical education;
13	(4) promote the Texas Disaster Volunteer Registry and
14	the Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Health
15	Professionals;
16	(5) consider incentives to assist with recruiting
17	physician volunteers; and
18	(6) encourage physicians and health professionals to
19	advocate for disaster planning measures in health care facilities.
20	SECTION 2. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
21	adding Subchapter F-1 to read as follows:
22	SUBCHAPTER F-1. DISASTER ISSUES AFFECTING PERSONS WHO ARE ELDERLY
23	AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES
24	Sec. 418.131. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
25	(1) "Disability" means, with respect to an individual,
26	a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits at least
27	one major life activity of that individual.

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(2) "Task force" means the task force established 1 2 under Section 418.132. Sec. 418.132. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The task force on 3 disaster issues affecting persons who are elderly and persons with 4 5 disabilities is established to study methods to more effectively: (1) assist persons who are elderly and persons with 6 7 disabilities during a disaster or emergency evacuation; and 8 (2) accommodate persons who are elderly and persons 9 with disabilities in emergency shelters. Sec. 418.133. COMPOSITION. (a) The task force is composed 10 of 11 members appointed by the governor, including: 11 12 (1) three members who are first responders; (2) 13 one member who represents municipalities; 14 (3) one member who represents counties; and (4) six members who represent persons with 15 16 disabilities. (b) A majority of the members appointed to the task force 17 must be persons with disabilities or guardians of children with 18 19 disabilities. 20 (c) Members serve staggered six-year terms with the terms of three or four members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered 21 22 year. 23 (d) The governor shall designate one member of the task force to serve as the presiding officer of the task force. The 24 presiding officer serves in that capacity at the pleasure of the 25 26 governor. Sec. 418.134. TASK FORCE STUDY. (a) The task force shall 27

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1	study methods to more effectively accommodate persons who are
2	elderly and persons with disabilities during a disaster or
3	emergency evacuation. The study must examine and make
4	recommendations on:
5	(1) the provision of informational materials to
6	persons who are elderly and persons with disabilities before a
7	disaster occurs on disaster or emergency evacuation;
8	(2) the accessibility of transportation and medical
9	supplies to persons who are elderly and persons with disabilities
10	during a disaster;
11	(3) different solutions for accommodating persons who
12	are elderly and persons with disabilities during a disaster or
13	emergency evacuation of a rural or urban area;
14	(4) the ability to effectively communicate with
15	persons who are elderly and persons with disabilities during a
16	disaster; and
17	(5) the availability of volunteers to assist persons
18	who are elderly and persons with disabilities during an emergency
19	evacuation.
20	(b) The task force shall develop and submit a written report
21	of the study and recommendations developed by the task force to the
22	governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
23	representatives, and each member of the legislature not later than
24	December 1, 2020.
25	(c) This section expires June 1, 2021.
26	SECTION 3. The Texas Division of Emergency Management is
27	required to implement a provision of this Act only if the

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1 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If 2 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that 3 purpose, the division may, but is not required to, implement a 4 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that 5 purpose.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
