Moscow Tenn

July 19th 1863

I received your letter No 15 today which found me well and glad to hear from you and I hope this will find you well allso [also]

I am stout and healthy and have ben [been] so far and hope I shall be while I am in the armey [army] for it is a bad place to be sick

It is not very hot here it has ben [been] cloudy for two or three days back but the sun has come out today in all its glory

ther [there] has nothing happened here laitly [lately] we have to go on picket every third day and drill a little every day so you see we have a little exersize [exercise]

the news still continues to be good I think that I shall be home in less than 6 months (at the outside) if I am alive.

## [Page 2]

I can get a furlough I expect after a while if I want they are furloughing for 30 days now but I think that I shall not take one Sam R is a wrighting [writing] to his wife today he is pretty well. I expect that we will get pay pretty soon and settle up with the government to see who has drawn more than their \$40 worth of clothing I expect that I have drawn about \$33 worth I will get money for what I do not draw

I got the letter that you wrote on the erick-Creek

I will try and get a pass to go to Memphis and see Darwin but then I dont [don't] know what hospital he is in and I might hunt there all day and not find him for there is 10 or 15 hospitals there and if he was ded [dead] I could .....[rest missing]
