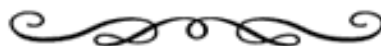

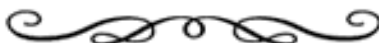

Gwendolyn Jane (Blomquist) Neumann of Plano, Texas passed away on December 15, 2017 at the age of 82. She was born on January 28, 1935 to Elmer W. & Addie (Tanksley) Blomquist in Karnes City, Texas. Gwen grew up in Austin, Texas where she graduated from high school in 1953. Gwen continued her education at the University of Texas and graduated with a degree in teaching. She worked at the University of Texas Library before becoming a homemaker.

A fifth-generation Texan, Gwen Neumann moved to Plano in 1967 and started a long-term pursuit of preserving local history and helping others discover family history.

In 1970, Gwen became an organizing member and first President of the Collin County Genealogical Society (CCGS) which not only serves local members, but genealogists across the United States with roots in Collin County. The core of the society's mission is to assist members with their family history research, preserve local records, and support the genealogy section of the Plano Public Library. Gwen exemplified this mission. She assisted others by presenting numerous talks and workshops across Collin County on topics ranging from "Beginning Genealogy" to "Courthouse Research."

She helped preserve local records by surveying cemeteries, transcribing county records, and submitting them to CCGS' Collin Chronicles: Records of Collin County, Texas, which publishes local records and other articles about Collin County. The Collin Chronicles currently reside online at the Portal to Texas History Web site. Further, under Gwen's leadership as the Book Committee Chairman and taking advantage of Gwen's fundraising expertise, CCGS donated more than \$150,000 (equaling more than 10,000 books, microfilm, periodicals, maps and other items) to the Genealogy, Local History, Texana, Archives department of the Plano Public Library.

Gwen inspired young and old. She helped young schoolchildren with their family history school assignments and volunteered at the Plano Public Library for many years assisting patrons with research. She was the organizing President of the Collin McKinney Chapter of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas, and a charter member of Plano's Mary Shirley McGuire Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. She co-authored the first five volumes of Revolutionary War Period Bible, Family and Marriage Records Gleaned from Pension Applications, 1981-1984, and four books of Dallas County history. She also served on the Collin County Historical Commission.

Gwen is survived by her loving husband of 62 years, Bill Neumann of Plano; children, Melanie Jane Wall and husband, Chris of Prosper, Robin Hamilton of McKinney and Brett Neumann and wife, Sherri of Allen; grandchildren, Jeremiah Wall and wife, Valerie, Alicia Wall, Christina Hawkes and husband, Brandon, Ashley Hamilton, Chelsey Brown and husband, Jason, Ayrone Neumann, Jazelyn Lindley and husband, Adam, Alexia Hall and husband, Matt, Cassandra Dabney and husband, Chris; great-grandchildren, Aiden Wall, Kennedy Wall, Harrison Wall, Tommy Lindley, Nevaeh Lindley, Cash Hall, Colt Hall, Kaylee Dabney, Jayla Dabney, C.J. Dabney and Lyric Dabney; and a host of other loving family and friends. She was preceded in death by her parents, Elmer and Addie Blomquist.

The family received friends during a visitation on a rainy Tuesday evening from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at the Turrentine-Jackson-Morrow (TJM) Funeral Home, 2525 Central Expressway North in Allen, Texas, just north of Plano. A funeral service was held at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, December 20, 2017 at the TJM Funeral Home Chapel. Interment followed at the Ridgeview Memorial Park cemetery in Allen.

Gwen Neumann was a leader, volunteer, fundraiser, researcher, author, mentor and friend to countless many for over 45 years in Collin County, Texas.

Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas

The "Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas" will include obituaries from the 1900s through 2010 and was submitted to CCGS by Gayle Maxson, author of three Collin County cemetery books:

1. *The people of Cottage Hill Cemetery. Denton, Texas: G. Maxson (1999)*
2. *The people of Old Celina Cemetery, Celina, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2002)*

A large portion of the obituaries were clipped from old Collin County newspapers by Juanita (Francis) Maxson, Gayle's deceased mother-in-law. Jane Huddleston at the Celina Heritage Museum allowed Gayle to transcribe six scrapbooks full of old obituaries (cut out and pasted with no documentation by persons long deceased). The Celina Record newspaper began publishing weekly in 1902. Papers from 1923-1924 are missing from the collection. **Thanks Gayle for preserving, consolidating, organizing and sharing this historical content!**

Philip Ramsey Hunnicutt: Funeral service for Philip Ramsey Hunnicutt long-time resident of Celina, Texas will be in First Baptist Church Monday at 3 p.m. with Rev. V. L. Harris pastor officiating assisted by Rev J. T. Bledsoe pastor of Bethel Baptist Church. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Scott Funeral Home. Mr. Hunnicutt, a retired farmer, died in a McKinney hospital at 3:30 a.m. Sunday after a long illness. He was born in Van Alstyne, Texas May 15, 1905, son of the late John T. and Willie Lewallen Hunnicutt. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Celina, Texas. Survivors are his wife, Geneva; one son, Lowell Hunnicutt of Celina, Texas; one sister, Juana Bray of Seminole, Texas; two brothers, L. F. Hunnicutt of Channing, Texas and Euell Hunnicutt of Amarillo, Texas; and four grandchildren. Pallbearers were Roy Ferguson, Charles Phipps, Frank Rucker, Horace Rucker, Lee Rucker and J. W. Callahan. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, March 27, 1969)

Albert C. Hunsinger: Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday in the First Baptist Church of Celina, Texas for Albert C. Hunsinger, 61, who died in a Dallas hospital Tuesday, December 3, 1968. Mr. Hunsinger, a former resident of Cottage Hill Community lived at 2848 Lucas Drive in Dallas, Texas. Ministers conducting the services were Rev. Ross Bourland pastor of Marilee Baptist Church and Rev. Robbie Harris of Dallas. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Scott Funeral Home. Mr. Hunsinger was born in Collin County July 16, 1907, a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Nathaniel E. Hunsinger. He was a member of the Cottage Hill Methodist Church. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Mary Ola Hunsinger of Dallas, Texas and a brother, James Hunsinger also of Dallas, Texas. Pallbearers were Mr. Hunsinger's nephews. Charles H. Jackson: Former Celina Man Died in Dallas: C. H. Jackson, 80, of 4719 Hallmark Drive, Dallas, died Monday. Funeral service was held Thursday at 1:00 p.m. in Restland Chapel, with the Rev. William Holmes officiating. He was owner of the J. Fred Smith Sand and Gravel Company and

was a member of the North Haven Methodist Church. He was a Mason. Mr. Jackson was formerly a resident of Celina, owning and operating a drug store for several years before moving to Dallas 53 years ago. The late Mr. and Mrs. W. N. Jackson were his parents. Survivors are his wife, the former Alma Smith (daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. G. B. R. Smith of Celina): a daughter, Mrs. C. B. Myers of Dallas; two grandchildren and one great grandchild. Mrs. Agnes Marrs was among those who attended the funeral. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, January 3, 1969) Charles H. Jackson was born February 22, 1888 and died December 31, 1969. (Restland Memorial Park, Dallas, Texas computer records)

Henry Shelton Jackson Sr.: Henry Shelton Jackson, 76, a former resident of Celina, Texas died Tuesday, March 29, 1966 in a Denison, Texas hospital. Funeral service was held at 10 a.m. Thursday in a Denison, Texas Funeral Chapel. Mr. Jackson was born in Missouri January 3, 1890. He was married December 7, 1956, at Idabel, Oklahoma to Mrs. Anna Nelson. He was a member of the Methodist Church. Burial was in Celina Cemetery. Survivors include his wife of Denison, Texas; three sons, G. R. Jackson of Weston, Texas, Delbert Jackson of Prosper, Texas and Henry Jackson of Irving, Texas; a daughter, Mrs. James House of Euless, Texas; three sisters, Mrs. C .R. Mills of Pilot Point, Texas, Mrs. Julia Wooten of Sanger, Texas and Mrs. Lee Saling of Keller, Texas and four grandchildren. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, March 31, 1966 p. 3)

Marvin B. Jackson: Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Sunday in the Prosper Baptist Church for Marvin B. Jackson, 81, of Prosper, Texas who died Saturday morning, February 17, 1962, in a McKinney, Texas hospital. Maynard Atkins, elder in the Celina Church of Christ and the Rev. Gene Russell, Baptist Minister, Prosper, conducted the services. Burial was in Good Hope Cemetery, directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home in Celina, Texas. Mr. Jackson was born February 22, 1881 in Parvin Community, a son of Mr. and Mrs. John M. Jackson. He was a retired farmer and a member of the Baptist Church. Survivors are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. George Peterman of Celina, Texas and Mrs. Margaret Gresham of Carrollton, Texas; three sons, S. P. Jackson of Frisco, Texas and V. L. and J. M. Jackson both of Prosper, Texas; a brother, R. L. Jackson of Fort Worth, Texas; a sister, Mrs. Nola Brown of Garden Grove, California; 13 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren. Robert Lewis Johnson: A Negro youth died of burns Friday morning, March 25, 1960, on the Charlie Angel farm west of McKinney, Texas on highway 24 when a heating stove exploded when he poured kerosene over some embers trying to start a fire. The resulting fire burned the Negro beyond recognition and destroyed the tenants' house. He had been working as a farm hand on the place for Paul Gilliland. The victim was Robert Lewis Johnson, 18, of Daingerfield, Texas. He had worked on the farm for several seasons and had just moved back last week. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, March 31, 1960 p. 1)

George B. Jones: Funeral services were held for George B. Jones, 53, at First Baptist Church of Celina, Texas at 2 p.m. Sunday. Mr. Jones whose home address was Frisco, Texas died in a McKinney hospital March 11, 1965. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home. Pallbearers were Kenneth Jones, J. W. Edmonds, Kenneth Hawkins, Dan Jones Jr., Wayne Perkins and Homer Burris. Mr. Jones was born July 13, 1911, a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Jones. He was a member of Bethel Baptist Church. Survivors are his wife; two sons, Jerry Jones of Chicago, Illinois and Sidney Jones of Sherman, Texas; three daughters, Mrs. Deloris Leary of Concord, New Hampshire, Mrs.

Glenda Kitner of Sherman, Texas and Mrs. Jewel Clutts of Celina, Texas; three step-sons, James Gerron of Fort Stockton, Texas, Glen Gerron of Reno, Nevada and Joe Gerron of Arlington, Texas; a step-daughter, Mrs. Ellen Miller of Dallas, Texas; three brothers, Dennis Jones of Gunter, Texas, Dan and Leslie Jones of Gainesville, Texas; three sisters, Mrs. Clara Burns of Sherman, Texas, Mrs. Mamie Clutts and Mrs. Dorothy Edmonds both of Celina, Texas and five grandchildren. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, March 18, 1965)

John Thad Jones: John Thad Jones, 78, a retired railroad section worker, died in a McKinney, Texas hospital Wednesday at 5:30 a.m. following a long illness. Funeral service to be held Friday at 11 a.m. in First Baptist Church of Celina with Rev. A. A. Johnston, pastor, officiating. Burial will follow in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home. Mr. Jones had lived in Celina, Texas for forty years. He was a member of the First Christian Church in Cleburne, Texas. He was born November 18, 1882, in Mississippi, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. S. B. Jones. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. J. T. Jones of Celina, Texas; four stepdaughters, Mrs. Lila Kockenter and Mrs. Robert Chaney both of Los Angeles, California, Mrs. W. S. Norman of Houston, Texas and Mrs. Leah Tingley of Gladewater, Texas; one son, Wilber Jones of Kansas City, Missouri; one step-son, Arthur Cantrell of Celina, Texas; two sisters, Mrs. Ella Wilkerson of Dallas, Texas and Mrs. Blanch Petty of Richardson, Texas; three brothers, Lee Jones of Dallas, Texas, Goodlette Jones of Seagoville, Texas and P. Carrie L. (Yates) Kelley: Mrs. John H. Kelley, 70, died in a McKinney, Texas hospital Friday, June 29, 1962. Her home was on Poplar Street in Celina, Texas. Mrs. Kelley was born Carrie Yates March 17, 1892, in Rutledge, Tennessee, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. M. Yates. She came to Texas with her parents when she was 12 years of age and the family settled near Celina, Texas. She had since lived in and near Celina. She was a member of Bethel Baptist Church. Funeral was in Bethel Church at 2:00 p.m. Monday, conducted by Rev. J. T. Bledsoe, pastor, and Rev. James Cross. Burial followed in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home. Pallbearers were Earl Yates, Loran Yates, A. H. Kelley, Choyce Kelley, Albert Lee Phipps, and Ray Grumbles. Survivors include her husband, John H. John Hamilton Kelley: Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Saturday in Bethel Baptist Church for John H. Kelley, 84, who died Thursday, February 10, 1966, in a Wichita Falls, Texas hospital. Rev. J. T. Bledsoe, pastor of the church conducted the service. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home. Mr. Kelley, a native of Texas was born August 14, 1881, a son of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Kelley. He was a member of the Baptist Church and a retired Celina area farmer. Survivors are a son, Albert Kelley of Anna, Texas; two daughters, Mrs. Lelia Maggie Benezer of Wichita Falls, Texas and Mrs. Curtis Loftis of Celina, Texas; a sister, Mrs. Lillie Phillips of Atoka, Oklahoma; a brother, Henry Kelley of Durant, Oklahoma; 11 grandchildren and 28 great-grandchildren. Pallbearers were A. H. Kelley, Choyce Kelley, Jimmy Hollingsworth, Jimmy Johnson, Jerry Kelley and Udell Thompson. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, February 17, 1966)

Minnie M. (Shaw) Kelley: Funeral services for Mrs. Walter Theo Kelley, 53, of Celina, Texas

was held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. in Bethel Baptist Church four miles northeast of Celina. Rev. J. T. Bledsoe pastor of the church officiated. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Morgan Scott Funeral Home. Mrs. Kelley's death occurred Friday, January 11, 1963, in a Sherman hospital. She was born in Collin County January 4, 1910. Survivors include two daughters, Ann Kelley of Celina, Texas and June Ward of Fairbanks, Alaska; two sons, Choyce Kelley of Celina, Texas and Clifford Kelley of Grand Prairie, Texas; mother, Mrs. Ida Shaw; brother, J. W. Shaw; three sisters, Mrs. Viola Smith of Pilot Point, Texas, Mrs. Vegolda Pruitt of Grand Prairie, Texas and Mrs. Maudie Fannin of Seattle, Washington; six grandchildren. Emmitt S. Kelly: Funeral service was held at 3 p.m. Wednesday at the Bethel Baptist Church for Emmitt S. Kelly who died Monday, May 15, 1961 at 1:30 p.m. in the McKinney, Texas hospital. Burial was in new Hope Cemetery northwest of Pilot Point, Texas. Mr. Kelly whose home was about four and a half miles northeast of Celina was born December 24, 1885 in Louisiana, a son of the late Arthur Kelly and Anna Culpepper Kelly. Survivors include his wife; sons, Fred Kelly of Morton, Texas, Dalton Kelly of Tioga, Texas, Hugh Kelly of Reno, Nevada, Joe Kelly of Celina, Texas and Charlie Kelly of Celina, Texas; daughters, Mrs. R .L. Snorgrass of Celina, Texas, Mrs. J. C. Miller of Celina, Texas, Miss Maggie Kelly and Miss Shirley Kelly of Celina, Texas; two brothers, Gene Kelly of Pilot Point, Texas and Delmar Kelly of Sanger, Texas; two sisters, Mrs. Lelia Lowrey of Haskell, Texas and Mrs. Lila Lewis of Delano, California; 27 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren. Delbert Lee Kindle: Funeral services were held at Turrentine Jackson Funeral Home in McKinney at 4 p.m. Wednesday for Delbert Lee Kindle, 29, who was killed Tuesday morning, July 23, 1963, near Big Springs, Texas when his truck smashed into a bridge rail; Burial was at Wilson Chapel Cemetery. Kindle was a grandson of Mr. Rebecca Kindle and a nephew of W .W. Kindle of Celina, Texas. Kindle, who lived in McKinney, Texas had delivered a load of milk for a Dallas dairy in Odessa, Texas and was returning to McKinney when the accident occurred. The cab was ripped away and Kindle was hurled out. A passenger, James Shew, 36, of Mesquite, Texas escaped injury. Kindle was born March 23, 1934, in McKinney, Texas. He married Miss Betty Corey of McKinney, Texas on July 3, 1952. Other survivors include his wife; one son, Randy Kindle; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. D. Kindle all of McKinney, Texas. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, July 25, 1963)

Ephraim Delbert Kindle: Ephraim Delbert Kindle died at his home in Celina, Texas on April 8, 1963, after an illness of several months. Born March 14, 1882, in McKinney, Texas, son of the late E. D and Mary Benton Kindle. He was a member of the Celina Baptist Church and a retired farmer. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Rebecca Kindle; six sons, W. W. 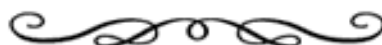
