# Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas

The "Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas" will include obituaries from the 1900s through 2010 and was submitted to CCGS by Gayle Maxson, author of three Collin County cemetery books:

- 1. The people of Cottage Hill Cemetery. Denton, Texas: G. Maxson (1999)
- 2. The people of Old Celina Cemetery, Celina, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2002)
- 3. Cottage Hill Cemetery, Collin County, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2004)

A large portion of the obituaries were clipped from old Collin County newspapers by Juanita (Francis) Maxson, Gayle's deceased mother-in-law. Jane Huddleston at the Celina Heritage Museum allowed Gayle to transcribe six scrapbooks full of old obituaries (cut out and pasted with no documentation by persons long deceased). The Celina Record newspaper began publishing weekly in 1902. Papers from 1923-1924 are missing from the collection. **Thanks Gayle for preserving, consolidating, organizing and sharing this historical content!**

Frank Allen Lee: Frank Allen Lee, 75, of Lee's Summit, Mo., died September 19, 1983. The services were held September 22, 1983 in Missouri. He was born in Collin County, Texas but had lived in Missouri since 1930. Mr. Lee was a storage clerk for Trans World Airlines, Inc. Before he retired in 1973. He was a member of Local 1650 of the Machinists' Union and a member of the Lee's Summit United Methodist Church. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Virgil L. Lee of the home; a son, Frank C. Lee of Franklin, Tenn.; two daughters, Mrs. Jacqueline Lee Ray, Denver and Mrs. Marcia Womack, Kansas City, three brothers, Guy Lee of Gladstone, Earl Lee of McKinney, Texas and Lewis Lee of Charleston, S.C., nine grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. She was a member of the Church of Christ. Surviving are her sons, Richard Lloyd of New Mexico, Curtis Lloyd of Celina and Dale Lloyd of Gainesville; daughter, Wandalene Clayton of Celina; sister, Veleva Farrell of Celina; 10 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. Joe Dee Shaun Loftice: Joe Dee Shaun Loftice, shot accidentally by another youth late Friday night died about 2:30 p.m. Sunday, August 10, 1986 at Methodist Hospital in Dallas, Texas. The 13-year-old Loftice was shot by another 13-year-old youth inside a mobile home at Trades Day Mobile Home Park on U. S. 380. According to McKinney Police Sgt. Paul Elkins, Loftice was shot once in the forehead with a .22 caliber revolver. The second youth was released to the custody of his parents. No charges were filed against the boy who told police he did not know the gun was loaded. Officer Elkins said that Loftice and the other boy had returned from hunting and were playing inside the mobile home with two 7-year-old boys when the shooting occurred. The youth picked up the revolver and pointed it at one of the 7-year-old boys and the gun fired hitting Loftice in the head. Loftice was taken by McKinney Fire Department ambulance to HCA Wysong Medical Center and was transferred by CareFlite helicopter to the Dallas hospital. I suppose that Thanksgiving seems to be a strange time to reflect on the death of a friend. However, this friend, who died three weeks ago, would have turned 97 on Thanksgiving Day. But on second thought, Thanksgiving may not be such an inappropriate time to remember him, for I am most grateful that such a man as Hugh Gearhart Stone crossed the path of my life. We, my parents, brother and I called him "Papa Hugh." For many years, he and his son, Wayne, farmed the land across from ours on Rock Hill Road, south of Prosper. Even though we lived in Dallas, I was at our place often, at all times. His custom was to wait patiently in his truck while Wayne worked whatever crop they might be growing that year. More than once, I drove by on the way to our south

pasture and noticed Papa Hugh sitting in the truck, nodding off to sleep. But at the sound of my approach, he would snap his head up, open his eyes, and let forth his wonderful, raucous laugh that always forced me to join in, no matter how hot the day or arduous the task that lay ahead in the south pasture. Invariably, he climbed out of his truck or at least offered his hand out of the window for a welcoming shake. While I appreciated the thought, I always steeled myself for this welcome. Papa Hugh had the strongest hands of any man I've ever met, including some top college offensive linemen. As I left him by saying, "Glad I got to see you," he would laughingly reply, "Yep, glad you got to see me," a saucy farewell quickly adopted by our family. His sense of humor was boundless, often taking the form of kidding my brother and I about how we would never, he feared, get married. He saw this as a horrible fate that should not befall either of us. The following story is a corrected version of the car accident that claimed the life of Tonia Waller on Monday, January 6, 1986. (2) Tonia Waller, 17, of Celina, Texas died Monday night as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident earlier in the day. Waller was a passenger in a car that was struck at the intersection of West Park Blvd. and North Dallas Parkway at 7:38 a.m. according to Plano Police Department investigating officer, Van

Note. "The car turned left onto North Dallas Parkway heading southbound and was struck by an eastbound pick-up truck driven by Scott Phillips of Carrollton," Van Note said. Waller was transported to a Plano General Hospital along with the driver of the car, Terry Perry, 22, of Pilot Point, Texas and another passenger, Paula Sparger, 21, of Frisco, Texas to receive treatment. Perry was treated for minor injuries and released while Sparger was hospitalized until Friday with back injuries before being released. Waller was placed in intensive care where she later died according to hospital nursing supervisor Nancy Hawkins. Phillips received no injuries. "Cause of the accident is still under investigation, however, our report shows that Perry failed to yield the right-of-way," said Van Note.
