## Alternative Fuel Vehicle Progress Report Fiscal Year Ended August 31, 2019

Beginning in fiscal year 2010, a new annual reporting requirement was established pursuant to House Bill 432, 81st Legislature, Regular Session that changed Texas Government Code Section 2158.005. State agencies that operate a fleet of more than 15 motor vehicles, excluding law enforcement and emergency vehicles, must report their progress towards achieving at least 50% of their eligible motor vehicles using compressed natural gas, liquefied natural gas, liquefied petroleum gas, methanol or methanol/gasoline blends of 85 percent or greater, ethanol or ethanol/gasoline blends of 85 percent or greater, or electricity, including electricity to power a plug-in hybrid motor vehicle.

The TCEQ fleet consisted of 401 motor vehicles, of which 169, or 42%, are considered alternative fuel vehicles. The total eligible motor vehicles subject to the statute is 22, of which 17, or 77%, are considered alternative fuel vehicles, thereby exceeding the requirement of this statute. All motor vehicles are purchased and there were no leases or recent alternative fuel conversion on any of the TCEQ's vehicles.

The agency's Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) usage has decreased due to a limited number of facilities that repair outdated LPG converted vehicles and the agency's decision to replace the outdated LPG vehicles by purchasing newer, fuel efficient vehicles. The E85 and Biodiesel fuels vehicles are continually being introduced into the agency's fleet whenever practical. The agency currently has 4, or 18% of 22 eligible vehicles that are considered hybrids.

The agency is below the required 50% of alternative fuel vehicles due to a realignment of assignments of regional vehicles and lack of alternative fuel vehicles available on the Term Contracts. However, the agency closely monitors our purchases to meet the requirement by purchasing new vehicles which accept alternative fuels, even for those vehicles not under the statute. Lack of alternative fuel locations remains a concern for the agency. Currently, there are only a few vendors who dispense E85 fuel and accepting the Voyager Fleet Card.

## Analysis of Alternative Fuel Usage Reported by Agencies Fiscal Year Ended August 31, 2019

Beginning in fiscal year 2010, a new requirement was established pursuant to House Bill 432. 81<sup>st</sup> Legislature, Regular Session that changed Texas Government Code Section 2158.005. This requirement states that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall collect reasonable information needed to determine the air quality benefits from use of compressed natural gas, liquefied natural gas, liquefied petroleum gas, methanol or methanol/gasoline blends of 85 percent or greater, ethanol or ethanol/gasoline blends of 85 percent or greater, biodiesel or biodiesel/diesel blends of 20 percent or greater, or electricity, including electricity to power a plug-in hybrid motor vehicle, at affected agencies.

The following analysis is based on vehicle data reported by impacted agencies in the Texas Fleet System maintained by the Comptroller of Public Accounts. This data is required to be reported by state agencies that operate a fleet of more than 15 motor vehicles, excluding law enforcement and emergency vehicles. Many agencies are not required to report data because their vehicles do not fall within the requirements of the statute. The TCEQ extracted the vehicle information from the Texas Fleet System to prepare this analysis and to reflect data reported by impacted agencies.

#### **Benefits Derived From Alternative Fuels**

Air quality benefits are not automatically achieved by switching from the use of gasoline or diesel to a different form of hydrocarbon fuel. Federal emission certification is fuel neutral in the sense that the same set of standards must be met regardless of the type of fuel that powers the vehicle. Provided below is a short summary of the Federal Tier 2 emission standards (<a href="https://www.epa.gov/regulations-emissions-vehicles-and-engines/final-rule-control-air-pollution-new-motor-vehicles-tier">https://www.epa.gov/regulations-emissions-vehicles-and-engines/final-rule-control-air-pollution-new-motor-vehicles-tier</a>) for light-duty passenger vehicles that began entering the fleet during the 2004 model year:

- They are based on a 0.07 grams per mile (gpm) full useful life (120,000 mile) fleet average nitrogen oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) standard;
- Vehicles are assigned to various "bins" with Bin 5 considered the "average bin" because it's useful life NO<sub>x</sub> standard is 0.07 grams/mile; and
- Manufacturer sales must average out to Bin 5 or better.

The "engine out" emissions of NOx, volatile organic compounds (VOC), and carbon monoxide (CO) from different fuels can vary, but no modern vehicle powered by any type of hydrocarbon fuel (gasoline, diesel, natural gas, etc.) is able to meet these very tight standards without an operable form of exhaust after-treatment, such as a catalytic converter. Excluding vehicles powered solely by electricity or hydrogen, the tailpipe NOx, VOC, and CO emissions of modern vehicles depend more on the efficiency of the exhaust after-treatment than on the type of fuel used by the engine. Provided below is a summary obtained from the United States (U.S.) Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Green Vehicle Guide data files that provides a breakdown of the 1,358 Federally certified light-duty passenger vehicles for the 2019 model year by fuel type and Tier 2 bin (<a href="http://fueleconomy.gov/feg/download.shtml">http://fueleconomy.gov/feg/download.shtml</a>). Tier 3 emission standards are being phased-in from 2017 through 2025, and have been converted to their Tier 2 equivalent categories here.

In order to obtain additional air quality benefit, it must be demonstrated that any new vehicle purchases/replacements that were going to come from Bin 5 are from Bins 1-4 instead. For 2019 and other recent model years, there are no production vehicles available powered by compressed natural gas (CNG), liquefied natural gas (LNG), liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), methanol, or methanol/gasoline blends.

Benefits are calculated by estimating how much less the Bins 1-4 vehicles emitted during the 2019 fiscal year than if they had been certified to Bin 5. The difference in emission rates by model year between Bins 1-4 versus Bin 5 is multiplied by the reported miles traveled during the 2019 fiscal year for the specific vehicle. Table 3, 4 and 5 on the following pages summarize the number of Tier 2 vehicles by bin number reported by multiple state agencies. Separate tables are provided that summarize both annual and average work day benefits of NOx, VOC, and CO for the 2019 fiscal year. An annual total of 250 working days per year was assumed for this analysis. Benefits were not estimated for the following situations:

- · Vehicles certified to Tier 2 Bins 5 or higher;
- Vehicles for which the Tier 2 bin category was not reported in the database; and
- Vehicles for which no mileage was either accumulated or reported during the 2019 fiscal year.

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Table 6, 7 and 8 are giving samples of the  $NO_X$ , VOC, and CO calculations for the Bins 2, 3, and 4 vehicles in the TCEQ fleet.
